

Rules

1. Show jumping classes are run under Pony Club Show Jumping Rules.
2. No stallions or ponies under 5 years permitted.
3. Open to Pony Club and NON Pony Club members. Age as of 1st January 2018
4. The judges' decision is final.
5. Hats. It is mandatory for all competitors to wear a protective helmet at all times when mounted with the chin straps fastened and adjusted so as to prevent movement of the hat in the event of a fall. The hat must be manufactured to one of the minimum standards listed in the [Pony Club Hat Rule 2018](#). Hat checks will be carried out. All hats must be tagged with an **aquamarine** Pony Club, British Eventing (BE) or British Riding Club (BRC) hat tag; this can be done on the day.
6. If a rider is on the lead rein in a class, they are not eligible to ride off the lead rein in another class.
7. For reasons of safety, NO CANTERING other than in warm up areas and competition rings.
8. Competitors must ensure that ponies are not left unattended at any time.
9. Photography – upon entering, competitors agree to being photographed by the official photographer.
10. Entry on the field is dependent upon and deemed as acceptance of these rules. Failure to comply with safety rules will result in being asked to leave the premises and no money will be refunded.

Legal Liability Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event nor The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other personal property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.

Health And Safety The organiser of this Event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organiser and all officials and stewards.

Venue and Directions

Aswarby Park is on the A15 between the Quarrington and Folkingham roundabouts. Please ensure you shut the gate on entering and leaving the park.

No water available on showground so please bring water for your ponies.

Please take all your litter & pony droppings home with you, the show site is where livestock are turned out.

Refreshments will be available from County Kitchen.

Timings

Please arrive at the ring in good time for your class. If you have a clash of classes please let the stewards know. Our aim is for everyone to be able to participate in all the classes that they want to enter.

Working Hunter Pony

Turn out as for hunting (plaited - unless a native breed with a full mane, plain tack, dark numnah, hacking jacket, tie and dark hat cover.) All competitors will be asked to jump a round of rustic fences. Places will be awarded to the pony and rider which in the judge's opinion would be most suitable to take hunting.

This year this class will take place in one ring. Everyone will jump and then all be called back into the ring to line up and then do their brief individual show.

Fun Accumulator Class

Each jump in the course will be given a points value depending on their difficulty/height. Competitors are given one minute to jump as many jumps as they can in any order to accumulate points. At the end of the minute a bell will ring and the competitor may then decide to jump the "JOKER" jump which has the greatest points value, if jumped successfully this will be added to your total. If you knock down the joker or refuse, the value is deducted from your total.

Competitors do not have to attempt the joker fence. If a pole is knocked in any other part of the course the points are not included in your total and the jump may not be jumped again in your round.

Tack and Safety Requirements

All competitors must wear jodhpur / riding boots and stirrups should be of the correct size to suit the rider's boots. They must have 7mm (¼") clearance on either side of the boot. Body Protectors are optional, air jackets are not encouraged if used in restricted spaces with other horses and ponies in the immediate vicinity. **Grass reins are not permitted but Daisy reins may be used for courses of up to 50cm.**

First Aid

First aid cover is provided by suitably qualified First Aid volunteers.
