CLASSES

CLASS 1 – MINI (Level 1)

70 – 75 cms. Riders to be under 14 years of age on 1st January 2012.

CLASS 2 – NOVICE (Level 2)

80 - 85 cms. Riders any age.

CLASS 3 – INTERMEDIATE (Level 3)

90 – 95 cms. Riders any age.

CLASS 4 – OPEN (Level 4)

1m – 1.05m. Riders any age.

ENTRY FEES (For all classes): - £50.00 per team (of 3 or 4 and best 3 scores to count)
- £15.00 per individual

NB – Entries will be strictly limited and will be accepted on a first come first served basis. Once a class is full that class will be closed. Entries will only be accepted on the official entry form (fully completed) and accompanied by full payment. DO NOT send entries by special Delivery! No refunds after closing date. Please read the Rules and Regulations on next page carefully!

ENTRIES CLOSE Monday 6th February NB. Secretary's post can be slow so don't leave it to the last minute!

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. The competition is run on the lines of BE JAS competitions. The main difference is that the emphasis is more on the rider's style and effectiveness and the harmony of the combination of horse and rider. The style mark for the horse does not apply in this competition, so that there is less emphasis on the horse's ability and style.
2. Style mark: alongside his/her position and effectiveness, the rider should show a difference in their style of riding between the show jumping and X-C phases.
3. The competition starts with a course of show jumps, not timed; followed by a course of simulated X-C jumps, run to an optimum time.
4. The aim of the competition is to achieve a clear round, with X-C as close to the optimum time as possible. Some X-C fences have a knock down top rail.
5. Penalties: knock down = 4 penalties; 1st disobedience = 4 penalties; 2nd = 8 penalties; 3rd (cumulative over both phases) = elimination; fall of rider / horse, error of course, re-taking an obstacle already jumped, exceeding twice the optimum time = elimination; every commenced second in excess of optimum time (X-C phase) = 1 penalty.
6. The winner will be the individual/team with the fewest total penalties.
7. In the event of a tie, the competitor / team with the lowest style penalties will win; if still equal, the closest to the optimum time will be the winner.
8. Maximum of 2 teams per Pony Club in any one class height unless space and time allows. (AVHPC excepted)
9. A rider/horse may only compete once for each team ie. a team must consist of 3 or 4 different riders/horses. A rider may compete more than once in a class on a different horse unless that class is oversubscribed when competitors will be limited to one ride in any one class. No combination may compete in more than 2 classes. Anyone entered in Class 1 (Mini) may NOT compete in Class 4 (Open) – this applies to both horses and riders.
10. All team members are automatically eligible for individual placings. Teams should be made up of members of the same branch but if there are enough individual entries to make up further teams we will do so regardless of the branch.
11. Legal Liability: Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor the Pony Club, nor any agent, employee, or representative of the bodies, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
12. Health and Safety: The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.
13. Cross-country dress should be worn for all classes. Pony Club numnahs may be worn. The standards for hats, dress and body protectors are laid down in The Pony Club Eventing Rules 2011/12. Medical Armbands and Body Protectors are compulsory for all classes. All competitors must have their hats tagged and have 2012 signed Spur permissions.
14. Objections must be made to the Secretary within 5 minutes of the end of the class in writing with a £20 deposit.
15. Declarations and objections should only be made by the Team Manager or a parent appointed to do so by the branch.
16. The organiser may, at her discretion, alter the schedule/rules as required.
17. Veterinary and medical cover provided.
