

General Conditions

- Courses will be open for inspection Saturday 24th March from 2pm to 4.30pm. The Park will be locked at 6pm.
- **NO COMPETITOR WILL BE ALLOWED TO START UNLESS CORRECTLY DRESSED. NO CROSS COUNTRY COLOURS – PC sweatshirts or plain dark coloured sweatshirts may be worn if hunting dress is not compatible. Hat silks should be navy or black.**
- Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times.
- Judged under Pony Club Horse Trials Rules 2012 relating to XC. Rules can be viewed and downloaded from www.pcuk.org. Rider's age as at 1st Jan 2012.
- **BODY PROTECTOR and MEDICAL ARMBANDS must be worn.**
- Hats conforming to current PC standards and displaying a PC tag must be worn.
- The decision of the judges is final and any objections must be made to the organiser with a deposit of £20, refundable if objection upheld.
- Non PC members should ensure that they have valid insurance to cover both themselves and their mounts.
- L fences incur 15 penalties.
- Competitors may compete on two horses/ponies if time permits.
- Pairs classes – competitors need not jump side by side, but neither member must attempt the next fence until their partner has cleared the previous fence. Any competitor jumping an L fence will incur 15 penalties. Pairs do not need to be from the same PC branch.
- It is not permitted to ride elsewhere in the Park. Any rider doing so will be eliminated from the competition and asked to leave. Any prizes will be forfeited.
- The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the stewards, officials and organisers.
- The organisers, owners and occupiers of the land take no responsibility for any loss, damage, theft, accident or injury incurred with this event to any person, animal, vehicle or equipment. Please do not leave litter or skip out boxes.

Classes

Please note that clear round pairs is limited to 30 pairs, postal entries will be given priority; entrants must be ready to compete at 9.30am prompt.

Class 1 Clear round pairs: Level 2 - 10 years and over Fences 75 - 85 cm approx.

Class 2a Pre Novice - Pony Club: 10 years and over Fences 75 - 85 cm approx.

Class 2b Pre Novice - Non Pony Club: 10 years and over Fences 75 - 85 cm approx.

Class 3 Pairs: Level 3 - 12 years and over Fences 90 cm.

Class 4a Novice - Pony Club: Level 3 - 12 years and over Fences 90 cm.

Class 4b Novice - Non Pony Club: Level 3 - 12 years and over Fences 90 cm.

Class 5a Intermediate - Pony Club: Level 4 - 12 years and over Fences 1 m.

Class 5b Intermediate - Non Pony Club: Level 4 - 12 years and over Fences 1 m.

Class 6 Open: Level 5 - 12 years and over Fences 1.10 m.
This class will be split PC & non PC if entry numbers permit.

Cups and Trophies

A keep trophy for the winner of each class.

Trophies to best Burghley member in each classes.

A bale of haylage for the competitor placed first in class, kindly donated by Top Crop Haylage.

Rosettes to 8th place in all classes.

Notes and Fees

- Following an equality of clear rounds and/or penalties, places will be decided by an optimum time over a short section of the course.
 - A horse/pony may only compete in two classes, individual or pairs, excluding Clear Round Pairs.
- Entry Fees for the Senior Course: Pairs £25.00 All other classes £15.00
+ £2 per competitor for paramedic cover.

HUNTER/EVENTER TRIAL – HAT TAGGING

All hats worn by competitors competing under Pony Club Rules must have their hat tagged to confirm that it complies with the Pony Club rules on standards as set out below:

It must bear the CE Mark AND a quality symbol: PAS 015:1998 or EN 1384:1996 or BS EN 1384:1997 (with the BSI Kitemark); Snell E2001 with the official Snell label and number; SAI Global AS/NZS 3838 1998 or AS/NZS 3838 2003.

If your hat has not been tagged by a Pony Club official to say that it complies with the above you will need to get it done before competing. When you come to collect your number bibs on Sunday you are asked to bring your hat to show that it has been tagged. Anyone wearing a hat that does not show a Pony Club tag will not be allowed to compete. Pony Club officials will be available in the Secretary's Tent to tag hats on the day but please leave yourself plenty of time before your class.

Hats with fixed peak are not allowed for Cross Country over fences 0.80m high and above.
