# Ring 1 Show Jumping (Entry Fee £12)

Commencing at 9am sharp

#### Class 1 Cross Poles

Jumps approx 30cm. Open to those 10 years and under.

Ponies can be on the lead rein/assisted. All clear rounds will receive a rosette, any combination entering class 1 may only enter class 2.

## Class 2 40cm Jumping

Jumps approx 35cm - 40cm. Rider any age.

**Single phase**. The course is in two parts [1] Not against the clock [2] Against the clock. Combination not to have been placed 1st in a jumping competition at 70cm or above.

# Class 3 50cm Jumping

Jumps approx 45cm - 50cm. Rider any age.

**Single phase**. The course is in two parts [1] Not against the clock [2] Against the clock. Combination not to have been placed 1st in a jumping competition at 70cm or above.

# Class 4 60cm Jumping

Jumps approx 60 cm. Rider any age.

 $\textbf{Single phase}. \ \ \textbf{The course is in two parts [1] Not against the clock [2] Against the clock}.$ 

# Class 4a 60cm Pairs Jumping

Jumps approx 55-60 cm. Rider any age.

Consecutive timed rounds.

# Class 5 70cm Jumping

Jumps approx 70cm. Riders any age.

**Single phase**. The course is in two parts [1] Not against the clock [2] Against the clock.

# Ring 2

## **Class 6 Clear round Jumping**

Commencing at 8.45am

Fences start 30cm and to go up through the morning until 12.30am

Pre-Entry & Entries on day only: £5 per round

#### Class 7 Horse and Hound

#### Commencing at 1pm

Jumps approx. 40-50cm. The course will be in two parts. The first round will be jumped by the horse and rider and will then be followed by the dog and runner. Time will be added for knock downs. The winner will be the team with the fastest accumulative rounds.

#### Class 9 First Ridden

Riders 10 years and under, ponies 13.2hh and under. May not be led, no cantering except for individual shows if desired. Judged on pony's suitability for all Pony Club activities.

# Class 10 Pony Club Pony

Riders not to have reached their 25<sup>th</sup> birthday on1st January 2024. This will be judged on manners, versatility and confirmation. You will be required to jump.

Section A: 14hh & under to jump 50cm Section B: 14.1hh & Over to jump 70cm For horse/ponies 16 years and older, in-hand or ridden. **Age of pony** to be stated on entry form please.

Section A: Grass Kept Section B: Stable Kept

Riders not to have competed at a PC Grassroots Area Competition or have been placed at BD Preliminary level or above.

**Preliminary PC70 Test 2022** 

**Please Note:** Entries are accepted and admission granted only subject to the following conditions, which deemed to have been accepted by each competitor. Please ensure you read them fully and carefully.

- 1. When mounted, riders must wear hard hats conforming to the Pony Club rules for 2024.
- 2. Show jumping classes run under Pony Club Rules for Show Jumping 2024.
- 3. For all other classes, the Pony Club standards for tack and turnout apply.
- 4. On day of show, horses/ponies may only be ridden by riders competing in the show.
- 5. No lunging in the warm-up arenas or lorry park.
- 6. Dogs must be kept on short leads at all times.
- 7. Do not drop litter use the bins provided.
- 8. Do not muck out your lorry / trailer onto the showground. Take your hay and muck home please.
- 9. In the event of cancellation of show, entry fees will be refunded, less £5.
- The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry without giving reason, cancel or alter the classes and times.
- 11. The organiser's decision is final in all matters. Any objection must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the results being announced and be accompanied by a deposit of £10.
- 12. No pony may be entered more than once in any class other than the Clear Round jumping and **No pony may compete in more than 3 jumping classes.**
- 13. Riders in lead rein classes may not compete off lead in non-lead rein classes. Lead reins to be attached to the noseband only.
- 14. When outside show rings and warm-up areas ponies must be ridden only at walk. Organisers reserve the right to eliminate any rider who breaks this rule or is seen to ride dangerously.
- 15. All class times are approximate and are given as a guide only. The organisers will endeavour to keep to time but it is the responsibility of competitors to appear for classes when required.
- 16. Competitors may be allowed to leave a class temporarily to compete in other classes at the judge's discretion.
- 17. Horses/Ponies <u>must NOT</u> be left unattended when tied up to lorries/trailers.
- 18. Rude or offensive language or behaviour will not be tolerated. Misuse of whip, spurs or bit will be deemed offensive behaviour and the competitor will be eliminated from the whole competition.
- 19. **INSURANCE**: All non Pony Club competitors/spectators are **not** covered by The Pony Club insurance and must have their own third party cover. The organising Branch and the committee of this event are not legally responsible for non-Members and their insurance will not cover you.
- 20. LEGAL LIABILITY: Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the Organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the Organisers of the event nor The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord, his tenant(s) or his licensee accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
- 21. **REASONABLE ADJUSTMENT**: The Pony Club is committed to ensuring that, wherever possible, members are able to access all aspects of the Branch and Centre activities we offer. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Any requests for Reasonable Adjustment must be made by 1st July 2024
- 22. **HEALTH, SAFETY & WELFARE**: The Organisers have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organiser and all the Officials and Stewards.
- 23. **HORSE VACCINATIONS**: No horse/pony may take part unless it has a record of vaccination against equine influenza which complies with the requirements set out in the Pony Club Vaccination Rules 2024.
