Entries Close: Thursday 18th Sept 2025 (no on the day entries permitted). Any late amendments to existing entries will only be facilitated by email consent where possible if after close of entries.

Location: Newbury Showground, Priors Court Road, Hermitage, Thatcham RG18 9QZ

Equine Entrance: Green Car Park, gates open 6.00 am – 8.00 pm, show start 8.30 am – 6.00 pm.

Entry Tickets & Vehicle Pass: Newbury Show will issue two tickets & one vehicle pass per each competitor entry. If you require additional equine entry related tickets these are charged at £18 per person & £10 per vehicle which must be confirmed by the close of entry date by email if not already specified in the additional information section on the entry system. For ticket processing, your name, email & phone contact details will need to be provided to Newbury Show for their ticketing system provider which will be done based on your inputted online entry information.

Secretary Tent & Competitor Numbers: The show secretary will be located within the branded branch marquee from 7.30 am. Hard copy competitor numbers will be provided with string/pins to attach. Once you have been issued your competitor number(s) you may wish to use your own bib, bridle or saddle cloth number but it must be clearly displayed at all times in the warm up & competition arena. Please be in the warm up no later than 10 mins before your class approximate start time so the secretary/steward can check you in.

Class Timings: Show starts 8.30 am – 6.00 pm. All classes will have 'not before times' listed on this schedule & any updates to timings will be emailed to competitors on Friday 19th Sept 2025 by 8.00 pm.

Rosettes & Trophies: Each competitor regardless of placing will receive a rosette, including clear round showjumping. Placed rosettes 1st - 6th in all classes for both showing & showjumping. For showing classes those placed 1st & 2nd will be automatically entered into a championship class with Supreme & Reserve Champion sashes & special rosettes & champion trophy. The Fancy Dress class & Concours d'Elegance class have winner trophies as well as supreme & reserve champion sashes. The showjumping classes have winner trophies & winner sashes.

Prize Givings: For showing classes, prize givings will be mounted in the competition arena at the end of each class as it concludes. For showjumping classes, prize givings will be unmounted at the secretary tent for those placed 1^{st} - 6^{th} directly after the class concludes.

Volunteers: This show is not possible without the help of volunteers, please ensure you are respectful, patient & helpful to any instructions or directions they may give. If you would like to volunteer at this show we have may roles available, please email the show organiser.

Sponsors: As this is a branch fundraising show we welcome all sponsorship support, with class sponsorship fees starting from £175 depending on specific class. Class sponsors will be promoted by the branch on social media, be named as titled sponsor of the class & have branded rosettes provided for the class. For all sponsorship enquiries please email the show organiser.

Equine Passports: A valid passport with vaccination records must accompany the horse/pony to this show (as required by DEFRA when travelling) & should be made available for inspection if requested when checking in with the show secretary on arrival for number collection. Vaccinations must be in accordance with current Pony Club Vaccination Rules 2024.

Tack, Dress Code & Attire: All competitors are requested to look smart, in show jackets (unless adverse weather conditions) & have suitable equestrian footwear. Pony Club members are requested to kindly ensure they wear their Pony Club badge, tie &/or stock. There will be tack & dress checks undertaken so please factor this into your warm up & timings. Hats must be in line with current British safety standards & in accordance with the Pony Club Rules; chin straps must be fastened at all times when mounted. Hat tagging is available at show secretary tent. Pony Club members are only allowed wear spurs if yellow hat tagged or permission recorded on Pelham. Any deemed inappropriate use of spurs whether by the steward or judge, the competitor will be asked to remove them immediately & failure to comply will result in disqualification from the class. Whips must be as specified in relation to the current Pony Club Rules & any deemed inappropriate or overuse of the whip will result in disqualification from the class. No training aids can be used in the competition or warm up arenas.

Competition Arena & Warm Up: All surfaces at the showgrounds are on grass & a map will be issued with all final competitor communications on Friday 19th Sept 2025 once close of entries passed. Only competitors are permitted to ride the equine they have entered at the showgrounds. No lunging permitted in warm up arena. We will have a limit on the number of competitors allowed in the warm up arena at any one time. No warm up arena access earlier than 30mins before the approximate scheduled class time.

Lorry Park: No equines or dogs to be left unattended when tied up to lorry/trailer. All droppings, forage & rubbish to be cleared fully on departure with own utensil & removed at your departure.

Dogs: All dogs must be on short leads, behave in public & droppings picked up immediately.

Water: Please ensure to bring your own supply of water for yourself & your animals.

First Aid On-Site: £5 competitor contribution required by Newbury Show per each online entry.

Rules: This show will be run in accordance with the current Pony Club Rules & for showjumping classes these will be specifically run under the Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2025.

Objections: The judge's decision is final in all matters. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, add or amend any of the conditions or competitions, as they deem fit & refuse entry at their discretion. Any formal objections must be made at the secretary tent with a deposit of £15 no later than 20 minutes after the incident, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.

Refusal Of Entry, Elimination & Falls: The organisers reserve the right to refuse an entry without stating a reason for doing so & reserve the right to eliminate any competitor who in their opinion places themselves or others in danger, is causing welfare concerns or fails to observe the rules or is not engaging in competitor polite etiquette or is not following the directions of the steward/judge. Any falls will automatically count as elimination & for competitors where no medical assistance is required, they must leave the ring unmounted & report to the secretary's tent for a fall report.

Reasonable Adjustments: The Pony Club is committed to ensuring that, wherever possible, members are able to access all aspects of the branch & centre activities we offer. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Any requests for Reasonable Adjustments must be made prior to close of entries by email to show organiser.

Withdrawals & Refunds: Withdrawals prior to close of entries will be issued a refund less an administrative charge of £5 (Entrymaster transaction fees not included). Withdrawals after close of entries will not be refunded except on the production of a valid doctor or vet certificate & will be at the discretion of the organiser. All withdrawals must be communicated via email only. Please allow up to seven working days for refund processing once email notification confirmed.

Event Cancellation Or Abandonment: In the event of cancellation or abandonment, entry fees will be refunded less the online Entrymaster transaction fees & cancellation or abandonment will be communicated directly to all competitors by email at the earliest possibility once the relevant decision has been confirmed by show organiser.

Insurance: All non-members competing at a Pony Club organised event, must have their own Third Party Liability insurance for themselves & their equine(s).

Legal Liability: Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organiser, or anyone for whom in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or the Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to equines, owners, riders, spectators, land, vehicles, their contents & accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.

Health & Safety: The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health & safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid & prevent accidents occurring & must obey the instructions of the organisers, officials & stewards.

Terms & Conditions Of Entry: By entering this show you are deemed to have accepted the above wording of this schedule to abide by as terms & conditions of competing.

SATURDAY 20th SEPTEMBER 2025 – APPROXIMATE CLASS TIMETABLE

Class 1 - In Hand Veteran - Class Start Time 08.30

Open to ponies & horses 16 years & over shown in hand. Judged on condition & turn out. Handlers must wear riding hat. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

Class 2 - In Hand 148cm & Above - Class Start Time Not Before 09.00

Open to ponies & horses 148cm or above. Judged on condition & turn out. Handlers must wear a riding hat. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

Class 3 - In Hand Up To 148cm - Class Start Time Not Before 09.30

Open to ponies & horses up to 148cm. Judged on condition & turn out. Handlers must wear a riding hat. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

Class 4 - Child Handler - Class Start Time Not Before 10.00

Open to children under 18 years old. In-hand class to show pony or horse being lead around in a group, stand up pony for inspection & trot up independently. Handler must wear a riding hat & be competent leading safely alone. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

In Hand Championship - Class Start Time Not Before 10.30

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} in classes 1, 2, 3 or 4. Handlers must wear a riding hat. Judge's choice for Reserve & Supreme champion position.

Class 5 - Side Saddle Association (SSA) - Open Equitation - Class Start Time Not Before 10.45

Open to both adult & junior side saddle riders whether SSA members & non-members. It is the rider not the horse or pony that is judged & qualifies in this class, there will be no reference to the sex, breeding or confirmation of the horse. This class is affiliated to the SSA & shall be run under the current rules defined in the SSA Member's Handbook. SSA members carrying their current Championship Points Cards are eligible for SSA rosettes to 3rd placed adult & 3rd placed junior & SSA Championship Points. There will be a special rosette to the highest placed SSA member aged under 14 on 1st January of the current year. Riding hats to current British safety standards must be worn for all riders under 18yrs of age in this class, adult riders not wearing such hats do so solely at their own risk. Competitors placed 1st & 2nd automatically go into subsequent Side Saddle Championship class.

Class 6 - Side Saddle Association (SSA) - Best Horse Or Pony Ridden - Class Start Time Not Before 11.15

Open to horses or ponies 4 years old or over ridden side saddle, conformation & manners will be taken into consideration. Horses/ponies will not be stripped. This class is affiliated to the SSA & shall be run under the current rules defined in the SSA Member's Handbook. A special rosette to the highest placed adult & junior members of the SSA. The highest placed coloured exhibit ridden by a competitor aged 16yrs or over (who has not already qualified) receives a special rosette & qualifies for the Side Saddle Final at the CHAPS Championship Show. Riders/owners need not be a member or their exhibit registered with CHAPS at the time of qualification, but in order to compete at the Championships, the rider/owner must be a showing member & their horse/pony registered with CHAPS before entering the final. Open to any type of exhibit. Lead rein side saddle riders are eligible for this class. Leaders must be correctly dressed. Riding hats to current British safety standards must be worn for all riders under 18yrs of age in this class, adult riders not wearing such hats do so solely at their own risk. Competitors placed 1st & 2nd automatically go into subsequent Side Saddle Championship class.

<u>Side Saddle Championship - Class Start Time Not Before 11.45</u>

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1st & 2nd in classes 5 or 6.

Riding hats to current British safety standards must be worn for all riders under 18yrs of age in this class, adult riders not wearing such hats do so solely at their own risk. Judge's choice for Reserve & Supreme champion position.

Class 7 - Best Lead Rein Pony - Class Start Time Not Before 12noon

Open to ponies 4yrs old & over not exceeding 148cms (pony cannot be also entered in classes 9 or 10 with same rider). Pony to be ridden by a child to have attained their 2^{nd} birthday on the 1^{st} January in the current year & not to have attained their 10^{th} birthday in the current year. Any suitable snaffle bridle. The leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. Whilst in the arena ponies must always be led by the leader. The leader should lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand. Judged on suitability of partnership & turnout of rider & leader outfit. To include a small show with walk & trot. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Children Ridden Championship class.

Class 8 - Prettiest Mare & Handsomest Gelding - Class Start Time Not Before 12.30

Open to ponies 4yrs old & over not exceeding 158cms. Pony to be ridden by a child to have attained their 2^{nd} birthday on the 1^{st} January in the current year & those not to have attained their 18^{th} birthday in the current year. To include a small show with walk & trot. Lead rein, assistance & independent riding permitted. Placings will be for separate categories of mares & geldings. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Children Ridden Championship class.

Class 9 - Best Pony Club Pony - Class Start Time Not Before 13.00

Open to ponies 4yrs old & over not exceeding 158cms. Pony to be ridden independently by a child to have attained their 4^{th} birthday on the 1^{st} January in the current year & those not to have attained their 18^{th} birthday in the current year. To include a small show, walk, trot & a small jump cross pole 40cm. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Children Ridden Championship class.

Class 10 - First Ridden - Class Start Time Not Before 13.30

Open to ponies 4yrs old & over not exceeding 148cms (pony cannot be also entered in classes 7 or 9 with same rider). Pony to be ridden independently by a child to have attained their 3^{rd} birthday on the 1^{st} January in the current year & have not to have attained their 12^{th} birthday in the current year. The pony must be calm, well-mannered & suitable for a child who is ready to ride without a lead rein. The judging will be focused on the pony not the rider. To include a small show of walk & trot. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Children Ridden Championship class.

Children Ridden Championship - Class Start Time Not Before 14.00

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} in classes 7, 8, 9 & 10. Judge's choice for Reserve & Supreme champion position.

Class 11 - Concours d'Elegance - Class Start Time Not Before 14.15

Open to both astride riders & side saddle riders, adult & juniors. The sole criterion for this class is the elegance of the picture presented by horse/pony & rider as well as the way of going of the horse/pony. Safe tack must be used. Detailed inspection of the rider's period costume is not required. Fancy dress is not permitted. Competitors are required to walk, trot & canter. No individual show is required but the judge may ask small groups of 3 or 4 riders to give short displays. Riding hats to current British safety standards must be worn for all riders under 18yrs of age in this class, adult riders not wearing such hats do so solely at their own risk. Competitors should produce brief notes about their costume for the commentator by email to the show organiser before close of entry. A special rosette will be awarded to the highest placed adult SSA member & junior SSA member in the class carrying their current Championship Points Cards. First, second & third placed horses/ponies not already qualified in this class will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at Onley Equestrian Centre, Rugby, Warwickshire on Friday 26th & Saturday 27th September 2025. If a horse/pony has already qualified, cards may be handed down to 6th place at judge's discretion. Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the arena which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner & rider/handler are, or become registered with the Concours d'Elegance Society within 21 days of the qualifying show. Class 12 - Fancy Dress (Adult & Junior Categories) - Class Start Time Not Before 14.45

Let your imagination & creativity go wild for this fun class. Open to adults & juniors of all ages riding horses/ponies who are over 4 yrs old, lead rein & assistance permitted. All riders must incorporate riding hats into costume & costume must be safe to parade in walk.

<u>Class 13 - Ridden Retrained Racehorse - Class Start Time Not Before 15.00</u>

Open to thoroughbred horses registered with RoR (free registration) who are 4 yrs & over, ridden by riders 12 years & above. Judged on condition, turnout & display of paces. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Class 14 - Ridden Small & Lightweight Hunter - Class Start Time Not Before 15.30

Open to horses exceeding 148cm & 4 yrs old or over, ridden by riders aged 7 yrs or above. Judged on correct type, condition, turnout & display of paces. Horse is not permitted to also enter class 15. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Class 15 - Ridden Middle & Heavyweight Hunter - Class Start Time Not Before 16.00

Open to horses exceeding 158cm & 4 yrs old or over, ridden by riders aged 15 yrs or above. Judged on correct type, condition, turnout & display of paces. Horse is not permitted to also enter class 14. Competitors placed 1st & 2nd automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Class 16 - Ridden Cob Type - Class Start Time Not Before 16.30

Open to horses & ponies exceeding 138cm & 4 yrs old or over, ridden by riders aged 7 yrs or above. Judged on type, condition, turnout & display of paces. Horse is not permitted to also enter class 17. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Class 17 - Ridden Maxi Cob Type- Class Start Time Not Before 17.00

Open to horses & ponies exceeding 148cm & 4 yrs old or over, ridden by riders aged 15 yrs or above. Judged on type, condition, turnout & display of paces. Horse is not permitted to also enter class 16. Competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Ridden Championship - Class Start Time Not Before 17.30

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1^{st} & 2^{nd} in classes 13, 14, 15, 16 or 17. Judge's choice for Reserve & Supreme champion position.

LEAGUE RULES:

- > This League is for Area 13 Pony Club Members only and you must be a current member throughout the League.
- ➤ League entry is automatic if you enter for any of the eligible Area 13 Winter Showjumping League competitions in classes that are for PC60 PC110.
- Combinations can earn points in each Class that they enter they get 1 point for each Class they participate in, 1 point for a double clear round & earn additional points if they are in the top 10 combinations i.e. 10 points for 1st place, going down to 1 point for 10th place across all the classes.
- Results for each Combination will be counted from 2 Classes only at each show. Note: Combinations may compete at more levels if they meet the eligibility criteria on the specific schedule, but the results will be taken from the combination's best 2 rounds on the day.
- ➢ Points will be counted from all 7 competitions across all Classes from PC60 − PC110 resulting in one overall Area 13 Winter Show Jumping League Champion and rosettes are from 1st to 10th place.
- New for 2025/26 will also be an Area 13 "Top of the Heights" Winners a winner rosette will be given to the person who does the best at each of the 6 competition levels.
- > Prize Giving for the Area 13 Winter Show Jumping League will take place on 1 February 2026 at the Spring Festival Qualifier at BCA.

Prizes to include:

- ➤ Overall League Rosettes 1st 10th place, Sash for Winner and prizes for at least 1st 3rd place
- Top of the Heights Winner Rosette for 1st Place and prizes
