Ring One - Indoor School

(Start 9am)

Course Builder – Elly Wishart All classes to be run under the PC Show Jumping Rules 2025

Class 1 - Candy Apple Cross Poles 30-40cm

Competitors may be led or assisted. Two Phase - Competitors jump the whole course, with the second half to be timed.

Class 2 – 40-50cm Screaming Scramble

Competitors may be assisted. Competitors jump the whole course timed. Table A4 - Any faults incurred added to their time.



Class 3 – 50cm Bats and Broomstick Pairs (£20 per pair)

Competitors may be assisted. Both jump the whole course. Table A4 - Any faults incurred added to their time.

Class 4 – PC60cm Jack-o-lantern Jumping

Two phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.



Class 5 – PC70cm Petrifying Poles

Two phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Class 6 – PC80cm Spine Chilling Stakes

Two phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.



Class 7 – Trick or Treat Accumulator

Starting at 65cm, with each jump increasing with height as the course goes on. Optional Joker fence at 1.05m – clear it and 10 seconds are deducted from your time.



Class 8 – PC90cm Spooky Stakes

Two Phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Class 9 – PC100 Haunted Hurdles

Two Phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Class 10 - PC110 Pumpkin Poles

Two Phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Results in Classes 4,5,6,8,9 & 10 will count towards the Area 13 Pony Club Showjumping League for Eligible Combinations.

LEAGUE RULES:

- This League is for Area 13 Pony Club Members only and you must be a current member throughout the league.
- League entry is automatic if you enter for any of the eligible Area 13 Winter Show
 Jumping League competitions in classes that are for PC60 - PC110.
- Combinations can earn points in each Class that they enter they get 1 point for each Class they participate in, 1 point for a double clear round and earn additional points if they are in the top 10 combinations i.e. 10 points for 1st place, going down to 1 point for 10th place across all the classes.
- Results for each Combination will be counted from 2 Classes only at each show. Note: Combinations may compete at more levels if they meet the eligibility criteria on the specific schedule but the results will be taken from the combination's best 2 rounds on the day.
- Points will be counted from all 7 competitions across all Classes from PC60 PC110 resulting in one overall Area 13 Winter Show Jumping League Champion and rosettes are from 1st to 10th place.
- New for 2025/26 will also be an Area 13 "Top of the Heights" Winners a winner rosette will be given to the person who does the best at each of the 6 competition levels.
- Prize Giving for the Area 13 Winter Show Jumping League will take place on 1
 February 2026 at the Spring Festival Qualifier at BCA.

Prizes to include:

- Overall league Rosettes 1-10th place, Sash for Winner and prizes for at least 1-3rd place
- Top of the Heights Winner Rosette for 1st Place and prizes

Area 13 Royal Windsor Horse Show Tickets 2026

The top 6 members in the PC110 League will be given one of the Area 13 places to ride at the Royal Windsor



Horse Show in the Pony Club 110 Show Jumping competition Sunday 17 May 2026 (subject to the conditions outlined in the rules section of this schedule).

Rules/eligibility:

- Must be a member on date of competition AND for the Windsor date
- Must have had no more than 16 jumping faults at any of the league competitions
- RIDER can only qualify for Windsor on one horse. If the rider is placed in the top 6 of the
 league on more than one horse, they select which one they want to take to Windsor. The
 Windsor qualification passes down to the next combination in the league assuming they meet
 the eligibility requirements.
- Reserves will be the next placed combinations from the League competitors providing they fulfil
 the criteria set out in these rules.
- Riders who have represented Area13 at Windsor Show Jumping on TWO or more previous occasions will not be eligible to qualify for the current year.

HHNPC RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Entries are accepted and admission granted only subject to the following conditions, which are deemed to have been accepted by each competitor:

- 1. The competition will be run in accordance with the Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2025.
- 2. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without stating a reason for doing so and also reserve the right to eliminate any competitor who in their opinion places her/himself or others in danger or fails to observe rules.
- 3. Horses or ponies must be 4 years of age or over and there is no height limit
- 4. Each combination may enter a maximum of 3 classes, and the 30cm rule will be observed. For example if a combination jumps 60cm, they may not jump 90cm.
- 5. There will be an unmounted prize giving after each class. Prize winning competitors are expected to be properly dressed as for competition for the prize giving.
- 6. All hats to be worn in the competition must be tagged with the new pink tag. Hats must conform to the current Pony Club standards and must have a chinstrap fastened at all times when mounted.
- 7. Pony Club members wearing Spurs must have passed either there C+ Ride, or Spurs Test and have a yellow hat tag.
- 8. Competitors should familiarise themselves with changes to the whip rule for 2023 onwards which will be strictly enforced, along with the Pony Club dress code.
- 9. No jewellery may be worn, except plain stud earrings.
- 10. Protest and Objections: Please see the Pony Club Show Jumping Rule Book 2025.
- 11. Refunds (less an administration charge of £5) will only be given on withdrawal prior to the closing date. Withdrawals after the closing date will not be refunded for any reason.
- 12. In the event of the competition being abandoned a refund of 50% will be given.
- 13. Late entries will be accepted only at the discretion of the organisers and will be subject to a £5 late entry fee.
- 14. All dogs should be kept on a short lead at all times and must remain in the car park area. Please clear up after your dog.
- 15. Horses/ponies competing may only be ridden by their competitor.
- 16. Please clear up all hay and droppings from around your trailer/horse box. Please do not tie hay nets to the side of trailers/horse boxes.
- 17. All horses and ponies must be vaccinated as per Pony Club rules and random checks will be undertaken, so please ensure passports are available.
- 18. All horses and ponies, when outside the arena and warm up areas, should be ridden at walk only to ensure the safety of all spectators and pedestrians.

DISCLAIMER: Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, competitors, spectators or any person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis. The organisers of this event have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health & safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.

REASONABLE ADJUSTMENT: The Pony Club is committed to ensuring that, wherever possible, members are able to access all aspects of the Branch and Centre activities we offer. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Any requests for Reasonable Adjustment must be made by **20th October 2025**

INSURANCE: Please be aware that all non-Pony Club competitors/spectators are not covered by The Pony Club insurance and must have their own third-party cover. The Hambledon Hunt (North) Branch of The Pony Club and the organisers of this event are not legally responsible for non-Members, and their insurance will not cover you.
