Classes marked with  are Sunshine Tour Qualifiers

Ring 1
Show Jumping
Commencing at 9.00 am sharp

If you compete in Ring 1 you may NOT compete in Ring 2 and combinations pony/rider must not have won any money in BS competitions.
No leading or assistance in Ring 1.

Individual rosettes to 8th place.
Team Rosettes to 6th place.

Class 1 Run and Ride

(Limited to 20 entries – enter early to avoid disappointment)

Jumps approx. 40-50cm. The course will be in two parts. The first round will be jumped by the horse and rider and will then be followed by the runner. Time will be added for knock downs. The winner will be the team with the fastest accumulative rounds.

Entry Fee: £15.00

Class 2 PC60cm Jumping



Jumps approx 60 cm in first round. Open to individuals and teams

(No Spurs allowed in this class)

Single phase. The course is in two parts [1] Not against the clock [2] Against the clock. **Competitors will jump both parts** unless eliminated and faults will be accumulative over the two parts. The winner will be the one with the least faults and the fastest 2nd phase time.

Combinations entering Class 2 may not enter Classes 4 or 5.

Entry Fee: £15.00

Class 3 PC70cm Mini Jumping



Jumps approx 70cm in first round. Open to individuals and teams

Single phase. The course is in two parts [1] Not against the clock [2] Against the clock. **Competitors will jump both parts** unless eliminated and faults will be accumulative over the two parts. The winner will be the one with the least faults and the fastest 2nd phase time.

Entry Fee: £15.00

Class 4 Accumulator

Jumps start at 50cm rising to an optional joker fence at 85cm. The complete course will be timed, and bonus points will be added for clearing the joker.

Combinations **not** to have competed in a jumping competition at 85cm or above.

Class 5 PC80cm Novice Jumping



Entry Fee : £15.00

Jumps approx 75cm in first round. Open to Individuals and teams.

Single phase. The course is in two parts [1] Not against the clock [2] Against the clock. **Competitors will jump both parts** unless eliminated and faults will be accumulative over the two parts. The winner will be the one with the least faults and the fastest 2nd phase time.

Entry Fee : £15.00

Ring 2

Mini Show Jumping

Commencing at 9.30 am Sharp

If you compete in Ring 2 you may NOT compete in Ring 1 and combinations pony/rider must not have won any money in British Show Jumping Competitions. No leading please but gentle assistance in Ring 2 is permitted.

Class 6 Clear round Jumping

Fences start 30cm and to go up through the morning until 11.20 am

Entries on the day only : £3 per round : £5 for two rounds (cash or card taken)

To start at approx 11.30 am:

Class 7 40cm Jumping



Jumps approx 30cm-45cm in the first round. Open to individuals only.

(No Spurs allowed in this class). Ponies can be on the lead rein

Their will only be one round and this will not be timed. All clears will share first place.

Entry Fee: £15.00

Class 8 50cm Jumping



Jumps approx 45cm - 50cm in first round

(No Spurs allowed in this class.)

Combination not to have been placed in a jumping competition at 70cm or above.

Teams of 3 or 4 with the best 3 scores to count.

Showing

Commencing at 9.00 am Sharp

Rosettes to 6th place.

Cups will be awarded to the highest placed Chiddingfold member

Entry Fee : £15.00 per class

Class 9 First Pony



Riders 10 years and under, ponies 13.2hh and under. May not be led. No cantering except for individual shows if desired. Judged on manners not conformation

Class 10 Lead Rein Pony



This class is strictly for genuine lead-rein riders only. Lead reins to be attached to the noseband.

Class 11 Veteran Pony



For ponies 16 years and older, on or off the lead rein. **Age of pony** to be stated on entry form please.

Class 12 Small Pony Club Pony



Ponies not exceeding 13.2hh. This will be split into 2 sections, A for lead rein ponies and B off the lead rein. Please state on entry which section. You **may** be required to jump one or two small fences but not obliged to.

Class 13 Large Pony Club Pony



Ponies exceeding 13.2hh

You **may** be required to jump one or two fences approx 60cm to 70cm

Class 14 Fancy Dress

Use your imagination but all costumes must incorporate a suitable riding hat!

Ring 4 Dressage

Commencing at 9.00 am

Entry Fee: £15.00 per class.

Entries will be limited so early entry essential.

Riders not to have competed at a PC Grassroots Area Competition or have been placed at BD Preliminary level or above.

Times will be available on www.ponyclubresults.co.uk on Friday 15th May.

Plaiting today is optional, but you will be expected to go at your allocated time.
Lead rein riders may enter Class 15. Please state on entry form if on the lead rein.

Class 16 PC Introduction to Dressage Test (2019)



This show is a Qualifier for The Sunshine Tour Championships held at The All England Jumping Course, Hickstead from Thursday 17 – Sunday 20 September 2026.

The Championships are for unaffiliated and amateur competitors in **Dressage** from Intro to Elementary, **Show Jumping** from Lead Rein to 1.05m, **Showing** for lead rein, in-hand, ridden, working hunter, veterans, plus many more. **Eventers Challenge** from 60cm through to 1m.

Qualification: 1st – 3rd in Dressage and Showjumping. 1st – 4th in Showing and Eventers Challenge.

Bring your Personal Qualification Form available from www.sunshinetour.co.uk or ask the Secretary for a “Wild Card”.

RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Please Note: Your signature on the entry form will be deemed to be an acceptance of these Rules and Condition of Entry. Please ensure you read them fully and carefully.

1. When mounted, riders must wear hard hats conforming to the Pony Club Rules for 2026. Pony Club members must have a PINK hat tag. Please come to the secretary if your hat needs tagging.
2. Show jumping classes run under Pony Club Rules for Show Jumping 2026.
3. For all other classes, the Pony Club standards for tack and turnout apply.
4. On day of show, ponies may only be ridden by riders competing in the show.
5. No lunging in the warm-up arenas or lorry park.
6. **Please do not bring your dog. The show ground has kindly been offered by a family who have sheep lambing nearby.**
7. Do not drop litter – use the bins provided.
8. Do not muck out your lorry/trailer onto the showground. Take your hay and muck home please.
9. In the event of cancellation of show, entry fees will be refunded, less £3.00.
10. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry without giving reason, cancel or alter the classes and times.
11. The organiser's decision is final in all matters. Any objection must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the results being announced and be accompanied by a deposit of £10.00.
12. No pony may be entered more than once in any class other than the Clear Round jumping and **No pony may compete in more than 3 jumping classes.**
13. **Riders in lead rein classes may not compete off lead in non-lead rein classes. Lead reins to be attached to the noseband only.**
14. When outside show rings and warm-up areas ponies must be ridden only at walk. Organisers reserve the right to eliminate any rider who breaks this Rule or is seen to ride dangerously.
15. All class times are approximate and are given as a guide only. The organisers will endeavour to keep to time but it is the responsibility of competitors to appear for classes when required.
16. Competitors may be allowed to leave a class temporarily to compete in other classes at the judge's discretion.
17. **Horses/Ponies must NOT be left unattended when tied up to lorries/trailers.**
18. **Rude or offensive language or behaviour will not be tolerated. Misuse of whip, spurs or bit will be deemed offensive behaviour, and the competitor will be eliminated from the whole competition.**
19. **INSURANCE:** All non-members competing at a Pony Club organised event, should have their own Third-Party Liability Insurance.
20. **LEGAL LIABILITY:** Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.
21. **REASONABLE ADJUSTMENT:** The Pony Club is committed to ensuring that, wherever possible, members are able to access all aspects of the Branch and Centre activities we offer. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Any requests for Reasonable Adjustment must be made by Tuesday 5th May 2026.
