Garth South Pony Club is delighted to host our autumn show at the prestigious event.

Everyone Welcome – Open to Members and Non Pony Club Members (including adults)

Entries Open: Monday 10th August 2026

Entries Close: Thursday 10th September 2026 (no on the day entries permitted). Any late amendments to existing entries will only be facilitated by email consent where possible if after close of entries.

Location: Newbury Showground, Priors Court Road, Hermitage, Thatcham RG18 9QZ

Equine Entrance: Green Car Park, gates open 6.00 am – 8.00 pm, branch show 8.30 am - 6.30 pm

Entry Tickets & Vehicle Pass: Newbury Show will provide 2 tickets for up to 2 ponies/horses and 4 tickets for 3 or more ponies/horses entered, with one horsebox parking permit included. For ticket processing, your name, email and phone contact details will need to be provided to Newbury Show for their ticketing system provider which will be done based on your inputted online entry information.

The Newbury Show Office will email all competitors their e-tickets directly on Monday 14th September, these will be scanned on-site on day of show and exchanged for equine area access wristbands.

Additional Tickets & Car Entry: If competitors require additional adult tickets, these can be pre-ordered through the branch via entry master to avail of a discounted price of £15 per adult otherwise on the gate Newbury Show prices apply. Children 3-15 years are £5 per ticket and children under 3 years old enter free but will require a ticket to exchange for equine area access wristband.

Secretary Tent and Competitor Numbers: The show secretary will be located within the branded branch marquee from 8.00 am. Hard copy competitor number plaques will be provided with string/pins to attach. Once you have been issued your competitor number(s) you may wish to use your own bib, bridle or saddle cloth number but it must be clearly displayed at all times in the warm up and competition arena. Please be in the warm up no later than 10 mins before your class approximate start time so the secretary/steward can check you in.

Class Timings: Show starts 8.30 am - 6.30 pm. All classes will have 'not before times' listed on schedule and any updates to timings will be emailed to competitors on Thursday 17th September 2026.

Rosettes & Trophies: Each competitor regardless of placing will receive a rosette, including participation rosettes for showjumping even if not placed or clear. Placed rosettes 1st - 6th in all classes for both showing and showjumping. Clear round jumping will also receive a participation rosette. For showing classes 1 - 7, those placed 1st and 2nd will be automatically entered into a championship class with Supreme and Reserve Champion sashes and special rosettes and champion trophy. The Fancy Dress class will have a supreme and reserve winner trophies and sashes. The showjumping classes have winner trophies and winner sashes.

Prize Givings: For showing classes, prize giving's will be mounted in the competition arena at the end of each class as it concludes. For showjumping classes, prize giving's will be unmounted at the secretary tent for those placed 1st - 6th directly after the class concludes.

Volunteers: This show is not possible without the help of our volunteers, please ensure you are respectful, patient and helpful to any instructions or directions they may give. If you would like to volunteer at this show we have many roles available, please email your availability to the organiser.

Sponsors: As this is a branch fundraising show we welcome all sponsorship support, with class sponsorship fees starting from £150 depending on specific class. Class sponsors will be promoted by the branch on social media, be named as titled sponsor of the class and have branded rosettes provided for the class. For all sponsorship enquiries please email the organiser. Sponsors are permitted to have a banner in our competition arena at Newbury Show 2026.

Equine Passports: Passports must be presented to the show secretary tent on arrival for inspection before unloading your equine. All passports must be in line with the latest Pony Club vaccination rules. Only equines with correct up to date vaccinations will be permitted to compete. If your passport is not up to date you will be asked to remove your equine from the showground immediately. Please ensure you always follow proactive bio security measures at the showground.

Tack, Dress Code & Attire: All competitors are requested to look smart, in show jackets (unless adverse weather conditions) and have suitable equestrian footwear. Pony Club members are requested to kindly ensure they wear their Pony Club badge, tie and/or stock. There will be tack and dress checks undertaken so please factor into your warm-up and timings. Hats must be in line with current safety standards and in accordance with the Pony Club rules, chin straps must be fastened at all times when mounted. Hat tagging available at show secretary tent.

Pony Club members may only wear spurs if they have attained C+ Riding Test or The Spurs Test. You must provide proof of this to the organiser upon request. A **YELLOW** hat tag must be worn. If in the opinion of the steward/judge a competitor misuses spurs they will be required to remove their spurs immediately. Failure to comply will result in disqualification from the class.

Whips must be as specified in relation to the current Pony Club rules and any deemed inappropriate or overuse of the whip will result in disqualification from the class. No training aids can be used in the competition or warm up arenas.

Competition Arena & Warm Up: All surfaces at the showgrounds are on grass and a map will be issued with all final competitor communications by Thursday 17th September 2026 once close of entries passed. Only competitors are permitted to ride the equine they have entered at the showgrounds. No lunging permitted in warm up arena. We will have a limit on the number of competitors allowed in the warm up arena at any one time. No warm up arena access earlier than 30 mins before the approximate scheduled class time.

Lorry Park: No equines to be left unattended when tied up to lorry/trailer. All droppings, forage and rubbish to be cleared up fully on departure with own utensil and removed with your departure.

Dogs: All dogs must be on short leads, behave in public and droppings picked up immediately.

Water: Please ensure to bring your own supply of water for yourself and your animals.

First Aid On-Site: £5 competitor contribution required by Newbury Show per each online entry.

Vet On-Site: Vet cover is arranged by Newbury Show, however, it is chargeable to the competitor if called out (Newbury Show have small and farm animal vets on site to triage and treat minor issues, with equine specialists on call over the weekend).

Farrier On-Site: Farrier cover can be arranged by Newbury Show – this is chargeable to the competitor.

Rules: This show will be run in accordance with the latest Pony Club rules and for jumping classes (excluding the clear round classes) will be specifically run under the Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2026. Please also see the specific Newbury Show 2026 Rules we are asked to circulate to each competitor (attached).

Objections: The judge's decision is final in all matters. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, add or amend any of the conditions or competitions, as they deem fit and refuse entry at their discretion. Any formal objections must be made at the secretary tent with a deposit of £15 no later than 20 minutes after the incident, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.

Refusal Of Entry, Elimination & Falls: The organisers reserve the right to refuse an entry without stating a reason for doing so and reserve the right to eliminate any competitor who in their opinion places themselves or others in danger, is causing welfare concerns and/or fails to observe the rules, competitor polite etiquette or directions of the steward/judge. Any falls will automatically count as elimination and competitors if no medical assistance required must leave the ring unmounted and report to the secretary's tent.

Reasonable Adjustment: The Pony Club is committed to ensuring that, wherever possible, members are able to access all aspects of the Branch and Centre activities we offer. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Any requests for Reasonable Adjustment must be made by *Thursday 17th September 2026*. Withdrawals & Refunds: Withdrawals prior to close of entries will be issued a refund less an administrative charge of £5 (entry master transaction fees not included). Withdrawals after close of entries will not be refunded except on the production of a valid doctor or vet certificate and will be at the discretion of the organiser. All withdrawals must be communicated via email only. Please allow up to seven working days for refund processing once email notification confirmed.

Event Cancellation Or Abandonment: In the event of cancellation or abandonment, entry fees will be refunded less entry master transaction fees and cancellation or abandonment will be communicated directly to all competitors by email at the earliest possibility once decision confirmed by show organiser.

Insurance: All non-members competing at a Pony Club organised event, should have their own Third-Party Liability Insurance.

Legal Liability: Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.

Health & Safety: Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers, officials and stewards.

Terms & Conditions Of Entry: By entering this show you are deemed to have accepted the above wording of this schedule to abide by as terms and conditions of competing.

SATURDAY 19th SEPTEMBER 2026 – APPROXIMATE CLASS TIMETABLE

SHOWING – ARENA 2

Class Entry Fee – PC Members £12 Non PC Member £15

Class 1 – In Hand Veteran - Class Start Time 08.30 am

Open to ponies and horses 16 years and over shown in hand. Judged on condition and turn out. Handlers must wear riding hat. Horse or pony must be shown in bridle. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

Class 2 – In Hand 148cm & Above - Class Start Time Not Before 09.00 am

Open to ponies and horses 148cm and above. Judged on condition and turn out. Handlers must wear a riding hat. Horse or pony must be shown in bridle. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

Class 3 – In Hand Minis Up To 148cm - Class Start Time Not Before 09.30 am

Open to ponies and horses of mini breeds up to 148cm (including part breeds). Judged on condition and turn out. Handlers must wear a riding hat. Horse or pony must be shown in bridle. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

Class 4 – Child Handler - Class Start Time Not Before 10.00 am

Open to children 4 yrs old on date of show to under 18 years old. In-hand class to show pony or horse being lead around in a group, stand - up pony for inspection and trot up independently. No assistance or lead rein permitted. Handler must wear a riding hat and be competent leading safely alone. Horse or pony must be shown in bridle. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent In Hand Championship class.

In Hand Championship – Class Start Time Not Before 10.30 am

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1st and 2nd in classes 1, 2, 3 or 4. Handlers must wear a riding hat. Horse or pony must be shown in bridle. No assistance or lead rein permitted. Judge's choice for Reserve and Supreme champion position with sashes and winner trophy.

Class 5 – Child Ridden Lead Rein Pony - Class Start Time Not Before 10.45 am

Open to ponies 4 yrs old and over not exceeding 148cms (pony cannot be also entered in classes 6,7,8 or 9 with same rider). Pony to be ridden by a child to have attained their 2nd birthday on date of show and no older than 8 yrs old on date of show. Pony must be shown in bridle. The leader must be 16 years old or over and may only lead one pony in a class. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. Whilst in the ring ponies must always be led by the leader. The leader should lead on the near side with the lead rein in the left hand. Judged on suitability of partnership and turnout of rider and leader outfit. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent Children Ridden Championship class.

Class 6 – Child First Ridden Pony - Class Start Time Not Before 11.15 am

Open to ponies 4yrs old & over not exceeding 148cms (pony cannot be also entered in class 5 with same rider). Pony to be ridden independently. To include a small show of walk & trot. One parent/guardian may be in arena to assist from a distance & give confidence to rider if needed but no lead rein. Rider must be 4yrs old at date of show & no older than 12yrs old at date of show. Handles on saddles are permitted but the reins must not be attached to the handle or to the saddle. Judged on suitability of partnership & turnout of rider. Competitors placed 1st & 2nd automatically go into subsequent Children Ridden Championship class.

Class 7 – Best Pony Club Pony Or Horse - Class Start Time Not Before 11.45 am

Open to ponies or horses ridden independently by rider no older than 25 years old at date of show. Riders must be 4 yrs old at date of show. To include a small show, walk, trot and a small jump cross pole 40cm. No lead rein or assistance permitted. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent Children Ridden Championship class.

Children Ridden Championship – Class Start Time Not Before 12.15 pm

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1st and 2nd in classes 5, 6 or 7. Judge's choice for Reserve and Supreme champion position with sashes and winner trophy.

Class 8 - Ridden Veteran - Class Start Time Not Before 12.30 pm

Open to ponies and horses 16 years and over. To be ridden independently, no lead rein or assistance. Rider must be 4 yrs or over on date of show. Judged on correct type, condition, turnout and display of paces taking into account pony/horse's age. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Class 9 – Ridden Cob - Class Start Time Not Before 1.15 pm

Horse or pony must be 4 yrs or over on date of show of cob type, can be lightweight, middleweight or heavy cob. To be ridden independently, no lead rein or assistance, rider 4 yrs or over on date of show. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Class 10 - Ridden Hunter - Class Start Time Not Before 1.45 pm

Open to horses exceeding 148cm and 4 yrs old or over of hunter type, can be lightweight, middleweight or heavy hunter. Must be ridden by riders aged 7 yrs or above on date of show. Judged on correct type, condition, turnout and display of paces. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent Ridden Championship class.

Ridden Championship – Class Start Time Not Before 2.15 pm

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1st and 2nd in classes 8, 9, or 10. Judge's choice for Reserve & Supreme champion position with sashes and winner trophy.

Class 11 – Ridden Prettiest Mare - Class Start Time Not Before 2.30 pm

Horse or pony must be 4 yrs or over on date of show. To be ridden independently, no lead rein or assistance. Rider must be 4 yrs or over on date of show. This is a fun class with a special rosette but not included in any championship class.

Class 12 – Handsomest Gelding - Class Start Time Not Before 3.00 pm

Horse or pony must be 4 yrs or over on date of show. To be ridden independently, no lead rein or assistance. Rider must be 4 yrs or over on date of show. This is a fun class with a special rosette but not included in any championship class.

Class 13 – Ridden Fancy Dress - Class Start Time Not Before 3.30 pm

Let your imagination and creativity go wild! Riders must incorporate riding hats into costume. Children must be 2 yrs old or over at date of show. Lead rein and assistance permitted. Entry fee required per each horse/pony partaking if group there. If entering as a themed group, entry fee applies per horse/pony. Sash and trophy for the winner and reserve sash.

Class 14 – Ridden Thoroughbred & Part Bred – Class Start Time Not Before 4.00pm

Horse or pony must be 4 yrs or over on date of show of thoroughbred breed or part breed. To be ridden independently, no lead rein or assistance, rider 7 years or over on date of show. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent Ridden Breed Championship class.

Class 15 – Ridden Arab & Part Bred - Class Start Time Not Before 4.30 pm

Horse or pony must be 4 yrs or over on date of show of Arab breed or part breed. To be ridden independently, no lead rein or assistance, rider 7 years or over on date of show. Competitors placed 1st and 2nd automatically go into subsequent Ridden Breed Championship class.

Class 16 – Ridden Spanish & Part Bred – Class Start Time Not Before 5.00 pm

Horse or pony must be 4 yrs or over on date of show of Spanish breed or part breed. To be ridden independently, no lead rein or assistance, rider 7 years or over on date of show. Competitors placed 1st & 2nd automatically go into subsequent Ridden Breed Championship class.

Ridden Championship – Class Start Time Not Before 5.30 pm

No entry required as automatically open to competitors placed 1st and 2nd in classes 14, 15, or 16. Judge's choice for Reserve and Supreme champion position with sashes and winner trophy.

FUN CLEAR ROUND JUMPING – ARENA 3

Class Entry Fee – PC Members £8 Non PC Member £10

Class 17 - Cross poles to 30cm (riders may be assisted or lead rein) - Class Start Time Not Before 08.30

Class 18 – 30cm (riders may be assisted or lead rein) - Class Start Time Not Before 09.30

Class 19 – 40cm (riders may be assisted or lead rein) - Class Start Time Not Before 10.30

Class 20 - 50cm (riders may be assisted or lead rein) - Class Start Time Not Before 11.30

Class 21 – 60cm (riders may be assisted in arena) - Class Start Time Not Before 12.30

Class 22 – 70cm (riders may be assisted in arena) - Class Start Time Not Before 13.30

Class 23 – 80cm (riders may be assisted in arena) - Class Start Time Not Before 14.30

Class 24 – 90cm (riders may be assisted in arena) - Class Start Time Not Before 15.30

Class 25 – 100cm (riders may be assisted in arena) - Class Start Time Not Before 16.30
