Please note: This competition is **not** intended for those members who have competed at Regional Championships PC70 and above.

All disciplines with comply with Pony Club rules from 2026

Class 1. Mini Champs TEAMS & INDIVIDUAL ODE: entry fee £60pp
(any combination entering this class may not enter any other class)

- Riders must be 16 years and under on 01/01/2026.
- Dressage Test: [Intro to Dressage 2019](#). Can be ridden in any normal riding bit and discrete use of the rider's voice is permitted as a supportive aid but must not disturb adjacent arenas
- Dressage Test may be commanded.
- Jumping height 60cm max.
- Individuals or Teams of 3 or 4. Best 3 scores to count.
- Neither riders nor Combinations to have competed at BE. Combination must not have been placed 8th or above at the Regional Championships.
- **Show Jumping** will take place before the Cross Country. For Technical Eliminations ONLY: Competitors eliminated Show Jumping may be allowed to go Cross Country at the discretion of the Show Jumping Judge.
- **Cross Country maximum height 60cm.** Anyone eliminated must leave the course at walk.
- **No outside assistance.**
- Run in accordance with PC Eventing Rules 2026.

Class 2. Mini Champs TEAMS & INDIVIDUAL DRESSAGE: entry fee £25pp

- Riders must be 16 years and under on 01/01/2026.
- Dressage Test: [Intro to Dressage 2019](#). May be ridden in any normal riding bit and discrete use of the rider's voice is permitted as a supportive aid but must not disturb adjacent arenas.
- May be commanded.
- Individuals or Teams of 3 or 4. Best 3 scores to count.
- Combination not to have competed above BD Preliminary level and not to have been placed in the top 8 in their arena at Regional Championships PC70 Dressage.

Class 3. Mini Champs TEAMS & INDIVIDUAL SHOW JUMPING | PC60cm: entry fee £30pp

- Riders must be 16 years and under on 01/01/2026.
- Teams of 3 or 4. Best 3 scores to count.
- Jumps approximately 60m in 1st round and 65cm in 2nd round. All double clears to jump off and one nominated team member to jump off against the clock if teams are tied.
- Teams/Riders eliminated in 1st round may still jump in 2nd round.
- Combination not to have been placed 8th or above in Regional PC70 Championships or above or completed any British Showjumping competition at 70cm or more in the first round.
- Combination of pony and rider must not have any BS winnings.
- No ponies to have been registered JA in the previous 12 months.
- No outside assistance.

Class 4. BEGINNERS INDIVIDUAL EVENTERS' CHALLENGE – 50cm: entry fee £30pp

- Riders must be 15 years and under on 01/01/2026.
- *Individual class prizes may be split by age if there are sufficient entries.*
- Jumps approximately 50cm in the Showjumping and will not exceed 50cm in the cross country phase.
- Ride the Showjumping phase then straight out to the cross country phase.
- Combination not to have competed at Area or Regional PC70 or above, or any British Showjumping competition at 80cm or more in the first round or have gone double clear at the Regional Champs PC70 show jumping class.
- Combination of pony and rider must not have any BS winnings.
- No ponies to have been registered JA in the previous 12 months.
- Assistance allowed but no leading rein.

Class 5. BEGINNERS INDIVIDUAL DRESSAGE: entry fee £20pp

- Riders must be 16 years and under on 01/01/2026.
- Dressage Test: WALK AND TROT DRESSAGE TEST 1 2026. Can be ridden in any normal riding bit and discrete use of the rider's voice is permitted as a supportive aid but must not disturb adjacent arenas.
- May be commanded and may have assistance but no lead rein.
- Combination to be genuine novice.

Class 6. GRASSROOTS INDIVIDUAL EVENTERS' CHALLENGE – PC70: entry fee £30pp

- Riders must be 17 years and under on 01/01/2026.
- *Individual class prizes may be split by age if there are sufficient entries.*
- Jumps approximately 70cm in the Showjumping and will not exceed 70cm in the cross country phase.
- Ride the Showjumping phase then straight out to the cross country phase.
- Combination not to have competed British Showjumping competition at 80cm or have gone double clear at the Regional Championships PC70 show jumping class.
- No ponies to have been registered JA in the previous 12 months.
- No outside assistance.

COURSE WALK: The Horse Trials courses (Showjumping and Cross Country) may be walked between 2.00 pm and 5.00 pm on Saturday 10th October 2026.
COURSE WILL BE SET AT PC60 SHOWJUMPING.

Class 1: 60cm ODE	1 st – 8 th Individuals; 1 st – 6 th Teams
Class 2: 60cm DRESSAGE	1 st – 8 th Individuals; 1 st – 6 th Teams
Class 3: 60cm SHOWJUMPING	1 st – 8 th Individuals; 1 st – 6 th Teams
Class 4: 50cm Eventers Challenge	1 st – 8 th Individuals
Class 5: 50cm Walk & Trot test	1 st – 8 th Individuals
Class 6: 70cm Eventers Challenge	1 st – 8 th Individuals

PRIZE GIVING: Unmounted but correctly dressed - time to be announced on the day.
DRESSAGE SCORE SHEETS to be collected, checked and signed for by the DC/Centre Proprietor/Team Managers of the Branch/Centre concerned, before the Prize Giving.

Health & Safety:

Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Any requests for Reasonable Adjustment must be made by 3rd OCTOBER 2026. Rules and Conditions of Entry

- Correct riding attire in accordance with the relevant Pony Club Rules 2026 must be worn when mounted. Hats must be worn to the Pony Club specifications for 2026. Cross-country colours may be worn for the jumping phase in the Eventers Challenge and body protectors are compulsory. The misuse of spurs, whips or any other items of tack causing discomfort to the horse may result in elimination, as will use of bad language.
- No ponies to be left tied to lorries/trailers, unattended.
- Pony Club hat tags are mandatory.
- Pony Club Spurs tags are mandatory for all those wearing spurs.
- Please print off numbers and bring your own bibs for all disciplines.
- Please treat all officials with respect: they are all volunteers and have given up their day to try to ensure that everyone has an enjoyable experience.
- On the day of the competition, horses may only be ridden by the competitor in designated warm up areas and must only walk in the horsebox park. No lunging is allowed in the horsebox park, if you need to lunge, please see the Secretary for guidance regarding where to do this.
- Refunds will be given upon the production of a doctor's or Vet's certificate within 3 days of the event.
- The judge's decision is final in all cases. Objections are to be lodged with the Secretary in writing with a £20 deposit (returnable if the objection is upheld) within 30 minutes of the incident occurring.
- Dogs must be kept on a short lead.
- Please do not muck out lorries/trailers into the field, and do not leave any litter. Please remove any droppings and hay and take home with you.
