All classes to be run under the PC Show Jumping Rules 2026

Class 1 – 30cm Candy Apple Cross Poles

Competitors may be led or assisted. Two Phase - Competitors jump the whole course, with the second half to be timed.

Class 2 – 40cm Scream if you want to go faster Scurry

Competitors may be led or assisted. Competitors jump the whole course timed. Table A4 - Any faults incurred added to their time.



Class 3 – 50cm Bats and Broomsticks

Competitors may be assisted. Two Phase - Competitors jump the whole course, with the second half to be timed.

Class 4 – PC60 Jack-o-lantern Jumping

Two phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.



Class 5 – PC70 Petrifying Poles

Two phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Class 6 – PC80 Spine Chilling Stakes

Two phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.



Class 7 – Trick or Treat Accumulator

Starting at 65cm up to 90cm, with each jump increasing with height as the course goes on. Optional Joker fence at 1.05m – clear it and 10 seconds are deducted from your time.



Class 8 – PC90 Spooky Stakes

Two Phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Class 9 – PC100 Haunted Hurdles

Two Phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Class 10 – PC110 Pumpkin Poles

Two Phase. Competitors jump the whole course in one round, with the second half to be timed.

Results in Classes 4,5,6,8,9 & 10 will count towards the Area 13 Pony Club Showjumping League for Eligible Combinations.

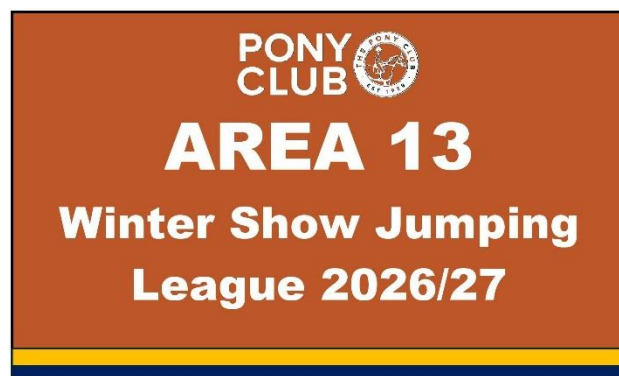
THE AREA 13 WINTER SHOWJUMPING LEAGUE 2026/2027

The shows included in the League and heights available at each show:

- Saturday 19 September 2026 | Garth South PC at Newbury Show Ground (PC60-PC110)
- Sunday 4 October 2026 | Wokingham PC at BCA (PC60-110)
- Saturday 24 October 2026 | Crawley & Horsham Hunt South at Sands Farm Equestrian Centre (PC60-PC90)
- Sunday 25 October 2026 | Hambledon Hunt (North) PC at Crofton Manor Equestrian Centre (PC60-PC110)
- Wednesday 28 October 2026 | Lord Leconfield Hunt PC at Sands Farm Equestrian Centre (PC60-PC90)
- Saturday 7 November 2026 | Garth Hunt at BCA (PC60-PC110)
- Sunday 3 January 2027 | Bisley & Sandown Chase PC at Merrist Wood Arena (PC60-PC110)
- Sunday 31 January 2027 | Wokingham PC Area 13 Spring Festival Qualifier at BCA (PC70-PC110)

LEAGUE RULES:

- This League is for Area 13 Pony Club Members only and you must be a current member throughout the League.
- League entry is automatic if you enter for any of the eligible Area 13 Winter Showjumping League competitions in classes that are for PC60 – PC110.
- Combinations can earn points in each Class that they enter – they get 1 point for each Class they participate in, 1 point for a double clear round and earn additional points if they are in the top 10 combinations i.e. 10 points for 1st place, going down to 1 point for 10th place across all the classes.
- Results for each Combination will be counted from 2 Classes only at each show. **Note:** Combinations may compete at more levels if they meet the eligibility criteria on the specific schedule but the results will be taken from the combination's best 2 rounds on the day.
- Points will be counted from all 8 competitions across all Classes from PC60 – PC110 resulting in one overall Area 13 Winter Show Jumping League Champion and rosettes are from 1st to 10th place.
- There will also be an Area 13 "Top of the Heights" Winners – a winner rosette will be given to the person who does the best at each of the 6 competition levels.
- **Prize Giving for the Area 13 Winter Show Jumping League will take place on 31 January 2027 at the Spring Festival Qualifier at BCA.**



AREA 13 ROYAL WINDSOR HORSE SHOW TICKETS 2027

The top 6 members in the PC110 League will be given one of the Area 13 places to ride at the Royal Windsor Horse Show in the Pony Club 110 Showjumping competition (subject to conditions outlined in the Rules section of this schedule).



Rules & Eligibility:

- Must be a member on date of competition AND for the Windsor date.
- Must have had no more than 16 jumping faults at any of the League competitions
- RIDER can only qualify for Windsor on one horse. If the rider is placed in the top 6 of the League on more than one horse, they select which one they want to take to Windsor. The Windsor qualification passes down to the next combination in the League assuming they meet the eligibility requirements.
- Reserves will be the next placed combinations from the League competitors providing they fulfil the criteria set out in these Rules.
- Riders who have represented Area 13 at Windsor Showjumping on TWO or more previous occasions will not be eligible to qualify for the current year.
- **THIS IS SUBJECT TO AN INVITATION BEING ISSUED TO AREA 13 TO TAKE PART IN THE PONY CLUB COMPETITION AT THE ROYAL WINDSOR HORSE SHOW.**

13TH - 16TH MAY 2027

Entries are accepted and admission granted only subject to the following conditions, which are deemed to have been accepted by each competitor:

1. The competition will be run in accordance with the Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2026.
2. Horses or ponies **must be 5 years or over** on the day of the show and no stallions without written permission from the DC.
3. All horses and ponies must be vaccinated as per Pony Club rules and passports presented to the secretary on arrival.
4. Each combination may enter a maximum of 3 classes, and the 30cm rule will be observed. For example, if a combination jumps PC60, they may not jump PC90.
5. There will be an unmounted prize giving after each class. Prize winning competitors are expected to be properly dressed as for competition for the prize giving.
6. All hats to be worn in the competition must be tagged with the new pink tag. Hats must conform to the current Pony Club standards and must have a chinstrap fastened at all times when mounted.
7. Pony Club members wearing Spurs must have passed either the Pony Club C+ Ridden Test, or Spurs Test and have a yellow hat tag.
8. **Whips:** only padded baton type is permitted.
9. **Jewellery:** Wearing jewellery while handling or riding a horse or pony is not recommended. To reduce the chance of injury, necklaces, bracelets (except medical bracelets), and large or dangling jewellery (including items attached to piercings) must be removed. The following are allowed: a wristwatch, a wedding ring, a stock pin worn horizontally, and a tie clip. If a Member chooses to wear any other type of jewellery at a Pony Club event, it is at their own, or their parent/guardian's risk.
10. Protest and Objections: Please see the Pony Club Show Jumping Rule Book 2026.
11. Refunds (less an administration charge of £5) will only be given on withdrawal prior to the closing date. Withdrawals after the closing date will not be refunded for any reason.
12. In the event of the competition being abandoned a refund of 50% will be given.
13. Late entries will be accepted only at the discretion of the organisers and will be subject to a £5 late entry fee.
14. The organisers of this event have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must obey the instructions of the organiser and all officials and stewards. It is a condition of entry that each competitor shall indemnify the above mentioned against such matter aforesaid.
15. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without stating a reason for doing so and also reserve the right to eliminate any competitor who in their opinion places her/himself or others in danger or fails to observe rules or compromises their horse/pony's welfare.
16. **No dogs in the arena or cafe.** All dogs outside the arena must be kept on a lead.
17. **All droppings, hay and rubbish to be picked up and taken home.**
18. No horse/ponies are to be left unattended when tied to the lorry/trailer.
19. Horses and ponies must be ridden at a walk unless in a competition or warm-up area.
20. There will be a photographer at this event. It is the responsibility of any individual not wishing to be photographed to notify them directly

Health & Safety: Organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers, officials and stewards.

Legal Liability: Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.

Reasonable Adjustment: The Pony Club is committed to ensuring that, wherever possible, members are able to access all aspects of the Branch and Centre activities we offer. Reasonable Adjustments are any actions that help to reduce the effect of a disability or difficulty. Any requests for Reasonable Adjustment must be made by *Tuesday 20 October 2026*.
