HOW YOUR COACHES KEEP DEVELOPING THEIR SKILLS

Coaches, committee and your DC Liz encourage members to learn, develop and progress through rallies, stable management, pc tests, badges etc. This is not simply to improve yourself but primarily for the welfare & wellbeing of the horse. It is the same for coaches. We should, I feel, keep developing and remain open minded to stay up to date and fresh to help our riders & their horses.

Coaches must attend courses (CPD, continual professional development) every year to remain registered with their governing body (BHS, PC, BE etc) and therefore have insurance. Last year British Eventing asked if I would train for & sit the BE level 3 qualification. This falls in line with the BHSI which I achieved in 2018 but I decided it would be good for my development to add this qualification.

The main part of study was the huge portfolio with involves you analysing & evaluating yourself, how you would like to develop, strengths/ weaknesses and goal setting.

Over the period of a year you work with a rider eventing at a high level (ie Blair 2* or above) and the portfolio follows their journey with their horse.

My profile rider was former Bennachie pony club member Caitlin Padfield.

Contents of the portfolio. Almost 100 pages!!

- Personal Development Plan
- Coaching Philosophy
- Performance profiling
- Annual plan
- 8 week plan
- 8 individual linked lesson plans with risk assessments & safety checklists

Riders code of behaviour

Prohibited Substance Guidance

- Reflective log of coaching
- Horse & rider profile
- Goal setting
- Risk review of annual plan
- Coaching program review
- Nutrition, hydration & weight management
- Once your portfolio has been submitted and signed off you are then required to sit an assessment which was on October 15th 2024 requires the candidates to:
- Coach a private dressage session
- Coach a private SJ session
- Coach a private XC session
- For each session prepare a risk assessment, safety checklists, lesson plans & afterwards write an evaluation
- After each session discuss with the assessor rules, regulations & content /standard for that discipline at the various international levels

I was really pleased to be told that my good friend Richard Johnston-Smith and myself were successful in the assessment and are now 2 of only 3 British Eventing Level 3 coaches in Scotland.

Since then I have been asked to continue delivering training in Scotland for British Eventing and to deliver training for the BE level 3 assessment and become an assessor.

So now onto the next venture!

We attended the British Dressage Scotland Ball this weekend where Lucy was awarded a prize for coming top of the D squad rider league. The children are allocated a squad following an assessment at the beginning of the year taking into consideration their age and an ability. Riders compete throughout the year, riding the "D squad" dressage test which is marked in quite a particular way, focusing on the rider's riding rather than the test movements like in a regular dressage test.

Lucy and Bertie traveled down to Arena UK to compete in the Pet Plan National Finals in the Prelim Bronze section, meaning that it was a national championships for that level, regardless of the age of the riders. Lucy and Bertie held their own against the adults but a couple of blips meant no rosette \circledast for them this time.

SENIOR TRAINING

4th January 2025

@ Bogenraith Equestrian Centre

We have an exciting day planned for our Senior Pony Club members to kick start the year. Our coaches and professionals are experts in their fields and ready to bring you a day of learning and fun. We have Sue Hendry, Julia Lyon and Emma King (Moray Coast Vet group) confirmed for the day so far.



With the introduction of the Spurs tags and spurs test we will have discussions on the use of spurs within the context of horsemanship and social licence and have an overview of the test.

We will be looking at the importance of Bridle & Bit Fit in the comfort and performance of the horse, another very topical subject with the focus on welfare issues, bitless riding and the importance of understanding what you are using progressing to a discussion on bridle lameness and other issues.

With our guest Vet and former PC member we will be looking at the importance of Health Planning for the individual horse and for yards and how this fits into your plans for the year. Discussions will include vaccination, worm control, health monitoring, biosecurity and general health management.

Your day if riding will also include a Flatwork Session and either Poles or Jumping.

Full day (9am-4pm guide) £90 Half Day Ridden £60 (stable management + 1 ridden session) Horse Care (10.30-2.30 guide) £35 (Exact timings will depend on numbers attending)

This day is aimed at members 14 years and above working towards or riding at C+ test level (younger members may attend at their DCs discretion)

The Fern Restaurant will be available all day for food and drink. They are happy to provide carry out style meals to be eaten during the lunch time discussion sessions in the conference room,

Stabling can be booked direct with Bogenraith via the website at £25 for a day stable, £48 for a night stable (£70 for two nights book one and contact direct to top up). There will be an Arena Event including Spring Festival Qualifiers on the Sunday to enable those travelling further to make a weekend of the trip.
