The Barrier Spring Festival is a competition series for Dressage, Show Jumping and Arena Eventing. Riders compete to qualify for one of three finals in England/Wales, Scotland or Northern Ireland.

There are levels for every competitive member depending on eligibility:

- Arena Eventing 70cm, 80cm, 90cm and 100cm;
- Dressage Grassroots, Novice, Intermediate and Open;
- •Show Jumping 80cm, 90cm, 100cm and 110cm.

AREAS 2025

Auchlishie 18th – 20th July 2025

The Areas Competition is one of the highlights of the Pony Club Calendar where all pony clubs and centres in Area 1, (20 branches and 20 centres) send teams and Individuals to compete and to hopefully qualify to go to Regionals and Championships in Dressage, Show Jumping and Eventing. Area 1 is the North of Scotland from the Forth and Clyde up to the Shetland Isles.

Area 1 Pony Club Qualifiers competition is on Friday 18th to Sunday 20th July at Auchlishie, Kirriemuir which is about 1- 1½ hours away. For those who are new to Areas, there is stabling on site, and riders camp in tents, trailers or lorries.

All riders should be competent at the height/level they choose and should have been competing successfully at that level. You must be capable of jumping 10cm more than the level chosen, as Areas is 'beefy' and more technical than your average classes at local pony club shows.

All riders are expected to take part in organised training so please attend all the training dates you can and use competitions such as the Arena Eventing, the Spring Show and Camp to gain

experience and confidence, plus get some feedback to make the most of your time at Areas. We want you to do well, enjoy the experience and want to go back and do it again the year after!

All members and horses must be active within Bennachie PC to compete at Areas. If you are not able to go to Regionals or Champs but would still like to be considered for Areas then just let us know.


