Tests are benchmarks of learning and are progressive so as you get older, the knowledge level and height of jumps increase. There is also a pathway from D+ that allows members to take the dismounted Care sections only at C+, B, The Lunge Test, B+ and finally AH. So if you do not have the horse power you can still progress with your knowledge!




Qualifying for a National Champs is a huge achievement and we are very proud of everyone who competed. It was also incredibly hot which provided additional challenges.

We would like our members that are <u>8 years</u> and under to enter the BEANIE TRIATHLON class. Members that are <u>8 years on the 2nd Nov</u> <u>'25</u> - you have a choice, BEANIE TRIATHLON or the TADPOLE class. Members between 8-25 years should consider entering your age class as per schedule TADPOLES, MINIS or JUNIORS.



SWIMMING

ALL age groups are invited to our <u>swim rallies</u>, especially if you're unsure or want to learn more about the swim phase (enter via BHPC Entry Master). We'll aim to send you fully prepared ahead of the competition!

For all classes with a swim phase, children need to be happy and confident in the water and able to at least travel through the water using a float, woggle or a similar floatation vest/fin.

SHOOTING

Members entering classes with a shoot phase (Tadpoles and above) need to learn to shoot safely ahead of the competition, however, our Tetrathlon club is **incredibly fortunate** and is able to help make that happen <u>- if you take action now!</u>

Shoot practice is free to members, taking place in Cam, Dursley, after school and into the evening, **EVERY Thursday and Friday**, ALL YEAR LONG!

FOR CHILDREN THAT DON'T KNOW HOW TO SHOOT: Geoff, our shoot instructor, welcomes you to visit for some extra fast track 1:1 sessions, any **Wednesday** after school, between now and our triathlon on 2nd November.

Monthly SJ rallies for Junior/Seniors with Jason Ferguson will continue, along with opportunities for arena eventing too.



Badge Rallies

This year, as well as the usual mini and junior badges, we have included some advanced badge rallies and some v. mini ones too so hopefully there will be something for everyone.

V. Mini = working towards E test
Mini = working towards D & D+ tests
Junior = working towards C & C+ tests
Advanced = working towards B test and above



Badge rallies are a fun way of gaining the knowledge required for the Pony Club efficiency tests whilst receiving a badge to wear on your PC jumper. They are also a great starting point for the Pony Club Quiz and Horse & Pony Care competitions.

Within the series, we have also included 3 more badges that go towards earning the mini and junior Blue Cross Equine Welfare Awards. Look out for the Check List at the end of this newsletter. We hope to be able to present some of these badges at the awards ceremony next year.
