We have various rallies and training through the year to prepare for the Area competitions and beyond. These are aimed at ALL levels as much as possible.

When it comes to team selection, those competing regularly and comfortably at the relevant heights will be preferred, as the Area competitions are strong and up to height.

#### \*\*NEW \*\*

Following feedback from trainers, managers, and committee members, we need to make every effort to ensure our members are fully ready for the 2024 Area Competitions.

Rather than compete against the NSEA, Cotswold Cup, SEG etc, we have decided to embrace what they can offer us and use various competition dates as 'Support Competition Days' (SCD) for our members. SCD's are not limited to the above and may be other PC or UA events too.

If you are interested in competing for CHPC at The Areas, then there will be a requirement to prove your competition record. An SCD list will be issued and regularly updated, whereby if you enter that event, a trainer, manager, or senior committee member will be there to watch, support and if they are a trainer, offer warm up support and course walking if it's required. What they see will be fed back to our Teams and Training committee for discussion during the year and then at a final Team Selection meeting.

This way, we can see what level members are riding at and offer advice on what level they should be looking to compete at, at The Area's, thus avoiding situations where members are competing at an inappropriate level, which can be dangerous.

Our teams need to be competitive and made up of the strongest riders at that level, therefore teams will be made up of the strongest riders first.

The SCD's are our way of seeing the way ponies are warmed up and competed and of course how our members conduct themselves. It's a fantastic opportunity to show us your progress across the year and to benefit from the support offered.

Area Competitions are always up to height and built to test the rider. We have enough experience on the committee to trust their judgement of individuals.

If you are unable to make many SCD's, then we'd expect to be sent a list of results from the competitions that you do enter.

#### \*\*\*\*\* ALL DAY RALLY AT OXSTALLS \*\*\*\*

Thursday 30th May to include Dressage, Showjumping and XC. This will be a very important selection rally for those wishing to be considered for Area Eventing Teams. There will be a selection of instructors and trainers available on this day for each discipline.

All the above events will be available to book through Horse-events.

Most of the Area competitions will be on grass so it is important to a practice on grass beforehand to get the feel of a less consistent surface than an arena. We hold grass rallies in the Spring/Summer.

Also new this year, A **Team Selection Committee** made up of instructors and senior committee members will put Area Teams together from those who want to be included. Some members will be asked to compete at a lower height than they would prefer. Decisions will be based on:

- A) Eligibility
- B) Experience at that level
- C) Competing Record
- D) Support and attendance of rallies.

#### Things to be aware of early in the season:

#### **Dress**

When (XC and tetrathalon) competing at Areas and above (and also at interbranch level ideally) you need a green hat silk and a red sweatshirt/long sleeved skin and preferably a red CHPC saddle pad. Members need to be smartly presented and closer to the time the Team Managers will clarify the details so you know what to expect. Hat and body protectors MUST be up to standard. Please ask team managers or check the PC website for details.

#### Flu vacs

For Area level (as opposed to inter branch) competitions, ponies need to have had a vaccination within 6 months of the date of the competition. Please read the PC rules in full to make sure you are within the rules as these are strictly enforced, and a very sad way to be eliminated before you start if you are not compliant.

#### Eligibility There are various rules for the different disciplines about who is eligible to enter for which

level at Areas and above. They can be complicated! For full details check the "Eligibility"

paragraphs in the Rule Books for the relevant discipline. (See Pony Club website)

#### Costs 2024 onwards. Entry fees for the Areas AND both the Regional and National

<u>Championships are paid by each competitor</u> Be under no illusion, entry is expensive! As

a pony club, it is sadly unsustainable to pay for our members.

#### **Trainers** Pony Club will provide trainer support if numbers support this, however, a contribution

from each competitor will be required. We understand that many members have their own regular instructors who have a deeper knowledge of the jockey and pony as a

combination. We will support those wishing to bring them to warm up.

Invitationals such as Blenheim, we are very lucky to be asked to enter a team(s) for some prestigious events. **ALL** selection will go through the committee.

**Entries** CHPC will make ALL entries going forward to ensure we have correct children in correct

teams.
