Flamstead Pony Club – Cancellation of Rallies in Bad Weather Policy

Purpose

To ensure that rallies and competitions only go ahead in safe weather conditions and to put in place a procedure for determining whether to go ahead with events when the weather is poor and/or there are thunderstorms forecast and/or Met Office yellow weather warnings for wind and snow.

Before the Event

When making a decision whether a rally or competition will go ahead, the following steps will be taken:

- Appoint a volunteer to monitor the weather forecasts regularly in the days leading up to the event;
- If there is a Met Office weather warning in place and/or thunderstorms forecast, the day before the event a conversation will be had with the Coach about whether to go ahead. If possible, agreement will be reached with that Coach about a time at which a decision will be made whether to cancel. The Coach's cancellation charge, if any, will be agreed; and
- Inform participants that the conditions are being monitored.

Decisions to Cancel

In the event of cancellation, inform participants of the decision to cancel as soon as possible, this should include:

- Cancelling the event on Horse Events;
- Emailing participants, in the event that Horse Events does not generate an automatic "Cancellation" email; and
- Putting an Announcement in the Flamstead Pony Club WhatsApp Group.

On the Day of the Event

If the event goes ahead:

- inform the individuals attending that they should satisfy themselves that the conditions for traveling from their location to the event are safe; and
- ask the Coach to check the arena and field conditions for safety before the event commences.

Thunderstorms
