**All Horses and ponies attending must be vaccinated against Equine Flu. Passports will be checked before you may unload. See below for full requirements.**

### **Equine Influenza Precautions and Requirements**

Due to the recent equine flu outbreak we have to implement some safety rules for the well-being of all horses and ponies attending.

So, as per BEF recommendations and those being followed by PC, on the weekend we will implement:

**\*\*A Passport check\*\*= NO PONY** may be unloaded before this passport check. Someone will be checking as you arrive or please leave your ponies in your trailer/ lorry until you are checked.

What this means:

All horses/ponies attending must have received two injections for primary vaccination between 21-92 days apart (can attend)

\*Booster injections - first booster no less than 150, no more than 215 days after above (5 - 7months)

**\*\*Further booster injections no more than one year apart.**

Any horse/ pony not complying should not be unloaded

Unfortunately, without the above you will be unable to participate in the camp.

The camp information is being provided well ahead of camp so anyone whose horse is not currently vaccinated will have time to complete the two primary injections prior to camp.

#### **List of bio-security guidelines for attending events:**

- When away from home take your own buckets, water and feed and do not allow other horses to share the buckets.
- Keep your horses away from nose to nose contact with other horses.
- If you handle another horse then wash your hands before handling your horse again.
- Disinfect your boots and outer clothing after each show.

#### **RULES AND PROVISIONS TO BE AGREED AND ACCEPTED WHEN APPLYING FOR ENTRY INTO ADULT CAMP 2019**

1. The normal insurance provisions negotiated on behalf of The Pony Club do not apply at camp. You are advised to have full Insurance cover for your horse or pony, including Third party Public Liability Insurance.
2. All horses and ponies attending must have current and up to date flu vaccinations and provide passport evidence on arrival.

3. The committee, instructors, and others responsible for the running of camp will endeavor to ensure your well being at camp but cannot be held responsible therefore.
4. No responsibility can be accepted for pony, tack and personal belongings of anyone attending camp.
5. Only persons who have applied and paid for camp may be in attendance.
6. Everyone must accept and abide by directions and instructions given by those responsible for the running of camp.
7. If the behavior of anyone at camp is such that the committee feel they may not continue at camp they will be asked to leave.
8. There will be no refund of fees once you have been registered for camp.
9. If in the opinion of the committee a horse or pony attending camp is in such condition that it cannot be expected to complete camp without injury or hardship to itself then the horse or pony will have to leave. Please ensure that your pony is fit and well.
10. In the event of an accident or injury the committee are authorised to take whatever steps are felt appropriate to secure your well-being and that of your horse or pony. You will be responsible for any fees necessarily incurred. In the event of an emergency next of kin will be contacted.
11. Every endeavour will be made to ensure that everyone receives instruction in groups of similar ability/need.
