

JERSEY DRAG HUNT PONY CLUB

TACK CHECK

RIDER – turnout

Pale Jodhpurs	Beige, cream or white permitted
PC jumper/rugby top	With white shirt and Pony Club tie (minimum is shoulders covered but long sleeves for Mounted Games and Pony Racing). This can be worn for all rallies & heights jumping.
Riding Jacket	Tweed or plain colour acceptable. Jackets must be worn for all competitions including hunter trials (noting for heights jumping jackets or PC jumper/rugby top are permitted).
Riding boots	Standard riding or jodhpur boots with a well-defined cut heel, half chaps permitted with short boots (same colour as boots and must not have tassels or fringes)
Tagged riding hat	Plain dark hat cover – for XC must be a skull cap without peak or flexible peak. Chinstraps correctly fitted and fastened.
Body protector	Compulsory for XC, but recommended for jumping – air vests are allowed for all activities, but must be in addition to a standard body protector for XC and worn on top of body protector
PC badge	Worn on left lapel of riding jacket with relevant test felt
Hair	Hairnets should be worn with long hair. Long hair should be secured appropriately with dark coloured ties or PC scrunchies.
No jewellery	Medical jewellery and wrist watch allowed
Medical armband	Required for XC where you have a medical condition
Spurs	Only permitted if rider has had form completed and approved
Whip	Showjumping & XC - no rider may carry or use a whip greater than 75cm or less than 45cm in length overall. Dressage – any length whip permitted

PONY – turnout

Tack	Should be clean, plain and in good condition Humane girths not permitted Numnahs should be a plain colour, except for XC where XC colours are allowed.
Martingale/ neckstrap	Only compulsory for XC, but recommended for jumping The only martingales permitted are Irish, Standing, Running or Bib only one of which may be worn at the same time. Standing Martingales may be attached only to the cavesson portion of the noseband fitted above the bit. Rein stops must be used for all running martingales. Neckstraps should be plain in colour and correctly fitting (4-5" clearance) and, for the interest of safety, recommended to be leather and with a fastening.
Bit	Must be snaffle for dressage, otherwise, pelhams must be used with two reins or roundings. Weymouth bits must only be used as part of a double bridle.
Stirrups	Should have 7mm (1/4") clearance either side of foot Stirrup bars to be in the down position
Bridle	Plain black or brown bridles are permitted. For safety reasons leather bridles are recommended. The Micklem Multibridle and bitless bridles are permitted.
Reins	Market Harboroughs and running, draw or check reins of any kind are forbidden. (A running, draw or check rein is one which is attached to the saddle, girth, martingale or breast plate on the horse). Grass and balanced support reins permitted – but only permitted to jump up to 50cm
Boots	Protective leg boots, if used, should be plain in colour. No boots allowed for Dressage. Hoof boots are not permitted
