## News, Competitions, Tests and Training

### Camp Feedback

Thank you to all who filled in the camp feedback questionnaire. There were not many replies but they were largely positive.

There are a few things that need comment.

### Timetables

All camps send parents a rough timetable, these are flexible and can be altered on the day to allow for changes in weather and opinion of coaches and organisers on the day. It is not possible/necessary for more details to be issued and, unless the parent is on duty, no need to know minor daily changes which, at junior camp, were available daily in field shelter.

Coaches are sent their groups before every camp.

This year's pre-camp rallies were very poorly attended which meant that some coaches had not met any of their ride before camp, it also makes it difficult to suitably allocate members to rides. This is a huge disadvantage to members and coaches and why pre camp rallies must be attended.

### Problems

If a parent has a problem with groups, activities or coach please speak to camp organiser, chief instructor or DC as soon as possible, as explained above unless we see members regularly it is difficult to make suitable rides and we recognised that sometimes change is required.

We are all volunteers and want our members to have a good time at camp.

### Awards at end of camp

This is a tricky one, there are many view points, none all the same, competitive, improvement, effort or achievement and unfortunately it is not possible to find something to suit everyone. We have tried different options over the years, if anyone has any ideas do let us know.

### Off site visits

It is not possible to do off site trips during junior camp due to insurance and safeguarding issues transporting other peoples' children. The cost of hiring a bus would be prohibitive, we do try to keep all camps as affordable as possible as it is at the heart of pony club activities.

## Pony Racing

It is coming to the time of the year when we start prepping for the 2026 racing season. The PRA run a series of training days all over the country where if you attend and pass the assessments you and your pony will be qualified to race at any of the pony club race days next year. In previous years Area 9 PC have run a training day at Caradoc but this year it is NOT happening. The nearest PRA training day to us is one in Warwickshire on the 2nd Nov. The training days are a great experience but the children and ponies need to be ready to canter at speed in groups and there will be more PRA days after Christmas. If you think your child may want some more experience I suggest they attend some of our racing rallies to gain more experience before attending a training day so they can enjoy the experience and pass the day.

We will be running a series of racing/galloping rallies over the winter for fitness and to prepare our younger less experienced jockeys in a fun safe environment. The first racing/galloping rally will be on the 27th Oct soon to be on Entrymaster. Our racing manager is Julie Mansell and will happily answer any questions.

Earlier this year The Pony Club held a competition for members to be ambassadors and take part in the Agria Blenheim Palace International Horse Trials opening ceremony. Applications were received from members all over the British Isles and one of our members, Martha D was selected. She had had to write a letter outlining the reasons why she wanted to be there and make a short video, all of which she did herself.

She had an amazing day and got to meet riders from all over the nation, as well as her favourite GB riders. The best part of the day was having her picture taken with Laura Collett, who went on to be crowned European Champion.



### Eventer Challenge

To compete at Blenheim is quite an experience and we had eight members representing our branch with a team in the 90cm and 100cm. The class takes the form of jumping 8 show jumps and then onto a course of cross country jumps all in the one arena. The last jump, after jumping solid fences is a joker show jump which, if you knock it down you get 6 penalties. With all those jumps in the arena and a large crowd watching it is quite an experience!

In the 90cm class we had a team of Ollie S, Molly M, Georgie P and Seren W. As a team they finished in 8<sup>th</sup> place. With Ollie being the highest placed with his great clear and taking 20<sup>th</sup> with over 150 competing in that class alone!

In the 100cm our team was made up of Georgie S, Lucy W, Henny P and Georgie A. Both Georgie's completed their rounds with Georgie A having a great clear and Georgie S just picking up 4 faults.
