What are the different activities...

Туре	Description	Dress code
Rally	A rally is a group lesson with a Pony Club Instructor. Rallies can be for flatwork, dressage, showjumping, x- country and more. Information on the particular rally is on the Calendar and on Horse Events.	Formal
Mini-Medley	A mini-medley is a longer rally (usually 1.5hrs) which consists of 30m flatwork, 30m jumping and 30m mounted games. This is a great session for newer members as it introduces you to a variety of disciplines.	Formal
Training	A training session will always be indicated upon booking. It is usually held to prepare for a competitive event.	Informal
Badges	Our Achievement badges provide a fun and interactive way for members to develop their knowledge of horsemanship and give them the opportunity to develop the skills to care for Horses and Ponies to the highest possible standards. Tests	The Pony Club Training structure encourages members to take tests which enables them to learn progressively about horse and pony care and riding. https://branches.pcuk.org/newforest/tests-achievement-badges/	Formal
Area Competitions	Every year Pony Club hold an Area 7 competition and you may be invited to attend. These take place for dressage, SJ, eventing and horse and pony care. If you are interested please speak to our chief instructor who will advise you further.	Formal
Shows & Events	Over the course of the year we run competitive events and shows which will be advertised on our calendar and on Horse Events.	Formal
Camp	Every year we hold a junior non-residential camp and a senior residential camp for our members. It is a fantastic opportunity to build confidence, friendships and have fun.	Separate Guide available
