

Junior Camp Kit List 2022

Please make sure everything is clearly named

Rider

- Hat** – correctly fitted & tagged. No fixed peak hats please.
- Body Protector** – Beta 2009 Level 3/2018 Level 3, correctly fitted. **Parents** – please check that your child's body protector meets the standard and fits correctly.
- Jodphurs** (white/cream/buff)
- Jodphur boots & chaps or long boots**
- Hairnet and hair ties**
- Long sleeve shirt for XC**
- Stock for XC (& pin for dressage)**
- PC shirt**
- Pony club sweater**
- Pony club tie & badge**
- Riding gloves**
- Hacking Jacket** (for Wednesday & Thursday)
- Waterproof coat** (and trousers if possible)
- Suncream & hat**
- Manual of Horsemanship, notebook and pen**
- Lunchbox, drinks and at least 1 litre of water, clearly named.**
- Hand sanitiser**

Horse

- Newly shod/trimmed pony** – please make sure they have been shod within 2 weeks of camp.
- Passport/flu certificate** – please ensure you bring your passport for checking on the first day. Any horse without a correct vaccination history and passport will be sent home.
- Hay & 3 hay nets** (on departure, leave 1 full hay net in stable and 2 full hay nets outside the stable for night/morning feeds)

- Hard feed & 3 feed buckets** (leave evening and morning feeds ready when you leave at the end of the day, with an empty bucket on top to keep marauders out!)
- 3 water buckets**
- Full grooming kit** (including plaiting bands)
- Fly Spray**
- Tack cleaning kit**
- Sweat rug**
- Stable rug** - if needed
- Outdoor rug** – if not being stabled overnight (horses that are going home will be in pens during the day).
- SJ Boots** - if needed
- XC Boots** - if needed
- Studs** - if needed
- Saddle, girth, stirrups, correctly fitted** – parents, please check stitching. Stirrups should have 1 finger width (½”) either side of the child’s boot.
- Numnah**
- Bridle** - parents, please check stitching
- Head collar & rope**
- Mucking out equipment for shavings.** Please note that you will not be able to share equipment so please bring a muck fork, broom, muck bucket or wheel barrow.

There will be no tack room facilities on site, so all tack and equipment will need to go home at night, or left in your trailer, at your own risk.

Please be diligent about arrival and departure times.

Please ensure that you follow social distancing rules and sanitise any common touch points such as tap handles, before and after use.
