

Horse/Pony KIT LIST Senior Camp 2026

An exciting part of camp is that campers are responsible, under the guidance of our yard managers and our instructors, to care fully for their own horses/ponies. The following items are required and must be named where possible.

1. Passport – this is compulsory - flu vaccination certificates will be checked on arrival.
2. Please make sure horse/ponies feet/shoes are in good condition and shod well
3. Good fitting saddle (100% safe and clean).
4. A spare dry girth is advised
5. Bridle plus additional bits if changes required for jumping & xc, martingale/breastplate - if used.
6. Head collar plus 2 x lead ropes.
7. At least 2 x numnah/saddle cloth **PLAIN** colours only black, white, blue, brown, OS&B Branch pads
8. Tack cleaning equipment – soap, 2 x sponges, a small water container (ice cream tub size)
9. Exercise boots and bandages – if required.
10. Studs & tools for XC – if required.
11. Stud girth - if required
12. Rugs i.e. sweat rug, fleece or stable rug, the evenings can get chilly, as required
13. Grooming kit – all you need for your pony, including shampoo, insect repellent etc
14. Plaiting equipment – scissors, needle, cotton or rubber bands.
15. Set of four stable bandages and gamgee
16. Tail bandage
17. Wash down bucket/bowl, sponges and sweat scraper
18. Haynet x 3 are advised
19. Hay bucket (**named with horse & rider**) - to provide loose morning hay at feed time by yard team before hay nets are given by campers in the morning.
20. Water bucket for stable (named).
21. Hay soaking bucket - if required
22. Mucking out equipment – **large skip/bucket** for mucking out is essential, shaving fork, broom, and a shovel is handy if deep bedding (all named).
23. Floor standing saddle rack for your saddle to sit on in the tack storage (named).
24. A wheelbarrow is handy for getting equipment/feed/nets from your trailer/lorry to the stable and for mucking out. Children can arrange to share a wheelbarrow with a friend.
25. 2 x feed bowls (**named with horse & rider**) plus feed scoops/measures
26. Hard feed & supplements – enough for the week.
27. Hay/Haylage etc – enough for the week (they eat a lot more than usual as there is no turnout and they will be working hard).
28. The stable beds will be made up for you by Tweseldown before you arrive and will contain at least two bales of shavings. You will need to bring with you additional bales of shavings for the duration of camp.
29. Please ensure that all saddlery stitching is checked & repaired prior to camp. Faulty tack will need replacing before the camper can ride. **We do not carry spares at Camp.**

Equipment, feed & hay can be stored in spare stables or lorries. Campers find it useful to have a waterproof box to store items whilst on the yard.

Saddles & bridles will be locked away overnight.

Please ensure that you have adequate private insurance to cover any items brought to Camp as The Old Surrey & Burstow Branch, The Surrey Union Branch, The Pony Club and Tweseldown Racecourse cannot be held liable and are not responsible for any damage or loss however it is caused.
