Those who attended really enjoyed the opportunity of a really informal training/competition which included the chance to ride a dressage test and jump a showjumping round at a height of your choice, supported by individual coaching. This is a fantastic opportunity if you are new to competing or want to brush up on your skills and something we are planning to repeat in March. Please complete these when you receive them as your help is essential to the successful running of our events, which raise vital funds for the branch. The first two where we will need help in 2024 are our Dressage Show at Priory Equestrian on Sunday 25 February and our Hunter Trials at Fair Oak Cross Country on Sunday 21 April.

We have more Multi Activity Days and Showjumping, Arena Eventing, Dressage and Mounted Games Rallies on offer as well as Stable Management over the winter. Please try to attend these rallies and trainings even when the weather doesn't feel that inviting. We continue to frequently lose money on venue hire by just not having the numbers.

Trot only Test to encourage our younger members to take part. We also hope to see all those members who have been honing their skills through the Dressage League! It is also an Open Show so entries from PC Mums/Dads welcome and do please spread the word to non-Pony Club friends and family.

Depending on the weather we hope that Cross Country training will start again in March, giving you time for a bit of practise before our popular Hunter Trials in April at Fair Oak, with classes starting from 60cm.

Remember to keep a close eye on your pony or horse over the winter to make sure they don't lose too much condition. The combination of wet and cold is the worst possible combination for them to cope with.

Thank you to all of you for your support of Petersfield Pony Club over the year. We end the year with 100 members making us one of the bigger branches in our Pony Club Area.



IMPORTANT NOTICE TO ALL MEMBERS 10 and UNDER

If your pony does not have a martingale, make sure you always come to rallies, events etc with a stirrup leather around the pony's neck.

This is for you to hold onto when things do not go right to avoid pulling on your pony's mouth and perhaps to save you from falling off.



SAFETY AT RALLIES

Please can you all make sure that unless you are riding in a lesson, that you only walk (mounted/dismounted), especially when going from your trailer to the lesson. The car park is a potentially dangerous situation with a lot of ponies, children, dogs etc milling around. It is the responsibility of everyone present to ensure that all measures are taken to safeguard both ponies and people at all times. Please be aware of safety.

Air jackets: When an air jacket inflates the sudden noise startles horses in the immediate vicinity thereby causing difficulties for the other members of a ride if used in a group ride in a confined area, e.g., an indoor school or outdoor manège. Air jackets are therefore not encouraged for group rides.

Also, it is your responsibility to pick up any horse droppings and hay in the parking area and in the school – if that is where the lesson is taking place.







TURNOUT

Would you please all pay careful attention to turnout of vourselves and your pony/horse when attending all Rallies and Training. Please make sure your boots are polished, odhpurs, tack etc are clean.

Your hair must be tied back securely, in a safe manner to reduce the risk of hair being caught and to prevent scalp njuries. A hairnet is therefore recommended.

The wearing of any sort of jewellery when handling or riding a horse/pony is not recommended and if done at any Pony Club activity, is done at the risk of the member/their parent/guardian. However, to stop any risk of injury, necklaces and bracelets (other than medical bracelets) must be removed, as must larger and more pendulous pieces of jewellery (including those attached to piercings) which create a risk of injury to the body part through which they are secured. For the avoidance of doubt a wristwatch, wedding ring, stock pin worn horizontally and/or a tie clip are permitted. It is recommended that stock pins are removed for cross country.

PARENTS & MEMBERS PLEASE NOTE: STIRRUPS

Ensure that your stirrups and boots fit correctly. For very good safety reasons, Pony Club rules require the following: "Standard riding or jodhpur boots with a fairly thin, smooth sole and a well-defined square cut heel" and "Stirrups should be of the correct size to suit the rider's boots. There must be 7mm (1/4") clearance on either side of the boot".

These rules together with the requirement not to wear other unsuitable footwear including boots and stirrups with interlocking treads, are there to minimise the risk of the foot becoming caught in the stirrup in a fall which can cause very serious injuries. If you are buying new boots check the size of stirrups with the new boots.

At competitions this is probably the most common problem picked up by tack checkers. We will be checking this at our MADs over the winter and will advise you if your stirrups are the wrong size, but please also check yourself.



These are always kept in stock; please contact me. If you need The Pony Club Manual of Horsemanship these can be purchased from Amazon – a must if you are taking Tests.

Medical Arm Bands are no longer compulsory wear, but it is still recommended that one is worn.

he Pony Club Quiz is a chance for members to test their equestrian knowledge in a fun and friendly team environment.

In 2024 the Pony Club Quiz will be back to being in person and will be having a Mini Section and a Junior/Senior section.



Centres and Branches can enter teams into both sections at Area Qualifiers which will take place on Sunday 3 March 2024 – venue to be confirmed.

- ➤ Mini Section: Teams of four. Ages to be 10 years and under on 1 January of competition year, with one member to be 8 years and under.
- > Junior/Senior Section: Teams of four. Must have two junior members (ages to be 13 years and under) and then two of any age up to 25.
- > The competition comprises of a Mini and Junior/Senior competition. All teams can be made up with one member only who has also competed at another level in this year's competition provided they are eligible. Complete teams may not compete at more than one level.
- Mini questions to be based on the 'E', 'D' and easier parts of the 'D+' Efficiency Tests and Mini Badges.
- ➤ Junior/Senior questions to be based on the 'C', 'C+' and 'B' Efficiency Tests and Achievement Badges.
- Questions will be based on the new syllabuses.
- > Format of questions will be mixed of activity rounds such as memory games/pictionary, guess what's in the bag, question/answer rounds and many more!
- ➤ Teams will move around the venue, each round will be on a different section of the quiz.

Highest place Centre and Branch teams from each section at Area Qualifiers will be invited to the Quiz Final.

BLUE CROSS HORSE & PONY CARE COMPETITION

VOLUNTEERS FOR BLUE CROSS COMPETITION NEEDED

re there any members who enjoy testing their knowledge? We need volunteers for this practical Quiz (unmounted) to pit their wits against other Area 13 teams.

Minis: Questions to be based on the Care section of the 'E', 'D' and easier parts of the 'D+' Efficiency Test cards and Mini Horsemanship Achievement Badges. At the Championships a small number of questions will cover all of the 'D+' syllabus.

Juniors: Questions to be based on the Care section of the 'D', 'D+', 'C' and easier parts of the 'C+' Efficiency Test cards and Horsemanship Achievement Badges. At the Championships a small number of questions will cover Advances Achievement Badges and all of the' C+' syllabus.

Seniors: Questions to be based on the Care section of the 'C+', 'B' and 'AH' Efficiency Test cards. Questions at AH Test level should be used sparingly as not all Branches/Centres will have 'AH' Test level competitors.

Teams make their way around different 'stations', each of which will comprise of a different theory or practical based topic. Ten minutes are spent at each 'station', during which time Members are asked a series of questions to be marked by the Assessor.

Points will be allocated per section, as well as for the manner in which Teams approach the competition. One round will be chosen, at random, as the 'tie-breaker'. In the event of a tie, the Team with the highest score in that particular round will be declared the winners.

The Area 13 Qualifiers are on Tuesday 28 May – venue to be confirmed. The winners compete at the final at The Pony Club Championships in August.

'D' and 'D+' TESTS | MINI ROAD RIDER & ROAD RIDER ACHIEVEMENT BADGES

he Pony Club Training structure encourages members to take Tests which enable them to learn progressively about horse and pony care and riding. The Tests are taken at recommended ages and begin with 'E' Test, Mini Road Rider Achievement Badge and 'D' Test. We feel these Tests are an important step on your horse owning ladder and can ultimately qualify you for a career in horses. We subsidise the costs of training and Tests with monies raised from competitions as part of encouraging all members to learn about horsemanship.

These are suitable for all members who have not yet taken any Tests, it would also be useful for you to attend the Stable Management Rallies to prepare you for the care questions. The Tests are all oral and practical and take place in small groups.

The Mini Road Rider Achievement Badge will be held via Zoom for both parts with Alex Van Randwyck on **Tuesday 23 January.**

The Road Rider Achievement Badge **Theory** part will also be held via Zoom with Alex on **Thursday 25 January**. The riding part will be held at the Multi Activity Day **on Saturday 2 March** at Priory Equestrian.

The Mini Road Rider Achievement Badge is a pre-requisite before taking 'D' Test and the Road Rider Achievement Badge is a pre-requisite before taking 'C' Test.

'D' and 'D+' training and Tests will also be held on **Saturday 2 March** at the Multi Activity Day at Priory Equestrian. You will need to be 8 years old to take 'D' Test and 10 years old to take 'D+'.

PREPARATION FOR 'C' TEST - UNMOUNTED

his is for those of you who are thinking of taking your 'C' Test this April. We are planning to have a 'C' Test ride at Easter Clinics; further details will be emailed early January.


You need to have your 'D+' and Road Rider Achievement Badge or be planning to take them in the spring. You will need to be 11 years minimum.

These are unmounted sessions to go over the pony care requirements of the Test. They are designed to help you feel more comfortable answering questions and practice your knowledge.





MY FIRST JUNIOR CAMP...


. . . LUCY ADAMS

I was a little apprehensive at first having never done a stay away before. I was worried Eddie wouldn't settle but he took to it really well. Everyone was so friendly and supportive.


I was with Laura for the week, and we were straight out on the cross country course on the first day which had its ups and downs but gave me something to improve on through the week.







