I run my own yard in Wantage, Oxfordshire now, and am in charge of up to twelve competition horses. I event and do dressage competitively and teach and ride all day long. It truly is my dream job and I'm extremely lucky to be able to pursue a career in horses.


I teach test preparation rallies for children working towards their 'C' and 'C+' Tests and am currently in training to become a 'B' Test examiner.
