Piggy (real name Georgina) is a genius of a rider really. One can learn so much just by watching the way she trains her horses and keeps them so confident and happy whether they are 4 years old or 4^* .

With up to 30 horses in the yard it was a big operation to keep it running smoothly. I was one of 3 working pupils; we rode all morning then did yard duties in the afternoon. So I had two horses at Piggy Frenchs, EPIC! Piggy then offered me the ride on her European Silver Medallist 'Some Day Soon!!' I think every Christmas came at once. He was a legend. If anyone has a hunger for eventing, there aren't many riders as naturally talented as Piggy to learn from, But also to learn the concrete foundations of managing event horses that I now use every day. So, I said my farewells to team French and my amazing friends in the Shire and headed to my new base in Berkshire; right next to BCA. I have a lovely five box yard owned by my original owner. I also love racing and alongside eventing I am now schooling National Hunt horses for Lawney Hill and re-training the youngsters to become eventers. They are perfect for the job and it gives you such a buzz when they go well.
