RULES: To be run in accordance with The Pony Club Tetrathlon Rule Book 2026

When entering competitors and their supporters agree to abide by the rules, which are in place for the welfare and well being of all concerned. Please do not breach the rules for any reason.

Queries may only be made by the Team Manager, in writing on a completed RAPC 'query form'. Queries must be lodged within 30 minutes after posting of results and within 10 minutes of final results being posted. Swimming queries can only be entertained within 10 minutes of the competitor's swim.

SHOOT

- All competitors who are shooting must be 8 years & over and to be confirmed by the branch Tetrathlon manager/DC, as having adequate training and being competent to shoot at competitions by email to the organiser.
- Pistols to be cased at all times until instructed by the Range Conducting Officer.
- Loaders must be 18 years & over, and to have adequate training.
- Pistols only to be carried by persons 18 years & over and kept out of sight in a locked car when not at the shooting range.
- Competitors to wear long trousers and suitable footwear that does not cover the ankle.
- Safety glasses or prescription glasses are compulsory at 7m and recommended for all.
- **Ear defenders (which cover the ears) are mandatory for all competitors** aged under 18yrs, at the firing point while shooting is in progress. Infants may not be in the range. All others aged U18 are encouraged to wear ear defenders while in the shooting range. See Area 14 website, Tet page.
- Pistols must be resting on the table and pointing down the range when being loaded and closed.
- Pistols to have safety flag inserted in the barrel except when the Range Conducting Officer authorises its removal.
- **Mobile phones are to be silenced and out of sight in the shooting range.**

SWIM

- The swim is in a 9m heated outdoor pool.
- No diving or tumble turns.
- 2 competitors per heat.
- Swimmers must wear swimming hats. 11 years & under may wear short wetsuits.
- **All competitors taking part must be capable of swimming at least 25m unaided.**
- Beanie swimmers who use floatation aids will score 700 points regardless of the distance they swim. Beanies only may use floatation aids.
- Non-swimmers may not compete in the swimming phase.
- One Supporter only may stand at the opposite end of the pool to the start.
- **No photography in or around the swimming phase, or photos from the swimming phase on social media.**

RUN

- Run will be individual at 1 minute intervals, not in a pack.
- Spikes may be worn. Inhalers cannot be carried and used whilst running.
- No pacing allowed. A penalty of 30 seconds will be incurred for each breach of this rule. See rule 28b, page 46.

RIDE

- Competitors may jump a lower course (taking 400 point penalty) or enter the novice class, where appropriate. For 500 point penalty they can jump down two or more levels.
- No horse or pony may go round the course more than twice.
- All competitors must wear a body protector (BETA 2018 level 3, blue & black label).
- Riding hats (no fixed peaks) to be tagged with a pink tag (see rule book) by their own PC branch.
- Spurs may only be worn by competitors with a yellow spur tag on their hat (having passed their C+ Test or Spurs Test).
- There will be a tack safety inspection before competitors are permitted on the course. Stirrups to be a suitable size for the boots: 7mm clearance on either side of the boot, see PC stirrup guidance.
- Whips must be 'padded' and maximum length is 70cm, and no less than 45cm.
- **The paper numbers will be provided and MUST be used for XC (helps the fence judges). Bring your own number bib.**
- Ponies to be accompanied by their passport with valid flu vaccination. There will be spot checks.
- Please clear droppings and hay; wheelbarrows will be available. Many thanks.
- No penning of ponies / electric fencing.
- Rules on refusals and outside assistance as per Tetrathlon Rule Book 2026. At the discretion of the fence judge, after 3 refusals, the competitor may continue on the course. They may be stopped later, and they must not 'take a lead' from another rider.
- On 40cm (white) course only: competitors may be assisted or led by ONE adult.
- On 70cm (yellow) course. Riders may have assistance by one person with a Reasonable Adjustment request, to be supported by their DC and submitted to the organiser by 1st June 2026. The assisting adult will wear a number bib for fence judges to recognise their role. There will be no assistance requests after 1st June nor on the day of the competition.

- On all other courses: NO outside assistance is permitted while a competitor is on the course, even if the competitor has been eliminated. It's in the interest of safeguarding rather than points.
- Slip Rail: if required, the fence judge, only, will give assistance by holding the pony for the rider to remount (without penalties). There will be a mounting block available.
- Fence judges are under no obligation to help a member remount (ie giving a 'leg up')
- Gate: there is no gate
- **For safety reasons, while course walking from 11am, when the cross country phase has started, only one adult per competitor may be on the course. No others, nor push chairs etc may accompany them. The woodland tracks must be kept clear, for the ponies on the course. Please be vigilant and give ponies and riders a safe path without surprises!**

- We would like to remind competitors of the long-term value of jumping a lower course if you are lacking experience or competition practise. It's better to jump well over a smaller course to gain experience and confidence.
 - There will be L fences so please ensure competitors are aware of the alternatives.
 - Any queries regarding the courses before the event, please get in touch with the organiser
 - Dene Farm XC is open for PC rallies and private schooling (8yr & over).

AWARDS

- Rosettes: individuals 1st- 6th, 1st- 3rd for shoot, swim and run
- Branch Teams can be made up from classes: Beanie: classes 1 & 2, Tadpole: classes 3, 4 & 5, Mini: classes 6, 7 & 8. Mixed teams will be made up where possible. No teams in Tri classes and junior tetrathlon.
- Organisers may alter prize allocation as they feel appropriate.
- All competitors who complete the event will receive a rosette.
- It is hoped competitors will stay for the prize giving.

- Results are posted as soon as the scorers have all the information that is required. If you need to leave before the prize giving, please give your contact details and your PC to the secretary, plus £5 for a SAE to send your rosette.
- **Dress for prize giving: Tetrathlon - riding kit. Triathlon – PC branch kit.**

- Information required for Entrymaster:
 - *Class, competitor's name (name on Pelham – no nicknames!), PC number, PC branch, age on 1st January, DOB, gun share, pony share, height of XC course competitor is jumping.*
 - *Concussion advice declaration. Confirmation of competence for shooting phase.*
 - *Confirmation the competitor entering their name to compete will be an acknowledgement that they are suitably trained and competent to compete at the level entered.*
 - *Tetrathlon manager with email and mobile number. Tetrathlon manager on the day with email and mobile number.*

We would like to assume every competitor entering our competition has done so with the prospect of enjoyment and the possibility of improving personal and/or team goals. CONCUSSION ADVICE: When entering, parents/guardians need to confirm that if their child has had a head injury/concussion within 21 days of the event, the child will not compete on 14th June.

LEGAL LIABILITY

Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other person or property whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.
2. All Branch Members, Centre and Centre Plus Members, those who are officials and volunteers helping at organised events are covered by The Pony Club third party Liability Insurance. It is important to understand the limitations of the policy and what is and isn't insured. The policy documents and FAQs should be read and digested by officials to ensure that all insurance conditions and obligations are understood and met.
3. All non-members competing at a Pony Club organised event should have their own Third-Party Liability Insurance. The Royal Artillery Branch of The Pony Club and the organisers of this event are not legally responsible for non-members and their insurance will not cover them.

DOGS

Preferably NO dogs at Dene Farm. Dogs are only allowed in car park on a short lead and with no disruption to other people or animals.

DIRECTIONS

From Salisbury take the A30 towards Stockbridge. Take first left after passing the Tidworth/Romsey (B3084) crossroad. Take second right into Wisdom Lane (after approx. ¾ mile). Dene Farm is at the end.

From Winchester follow signs for Stockbridge and then take A30 towards Salisbury. Turn right for Nether Wallop. Right at the T junction and then take first right (Wisdom Lane).

From Andover take A343 towards Salisbury, past the Army Air Museum, turn left at crossroads beside the George Inn & Pinchbeck Garage. Drive through Nether Wallop (approx. 1 mile). Dene Farm is on the left.
