Please note that throughout the levels of competition, the jumping heights increase at each stage. For example, PC90 is 90cm in first round at Areas going to 95cm in the second round. If you qualify it is 95cm in the first round at Championships and 100cm in the second round. You therefore need to be competent at jumping the class height and up to 10cm above. This applies at all AREA levels. Full information on course height, widths and technical elements can be found in discipline rule books.

It is entirely the responsibility of the members to check their eligibility and be familiar with the rules. To read and understand the WHPC Selection Policy and to make any applications for teams and entries in good time.

Junior/Novice	Not an area competition – simplified races, suitable for lead rein or beginners
Junior	Not to have attained their 11 <sup>th</sup> birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January
Pairs	To have attained their 11 <sup>th</sup> but not their 19 <sup>th</sup> birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January
Senior	To have attained their 11 <sup>th</sup> birthday by 1 <sup>st</sup> January

NATIONAL QUIZ	4 Members in a Team
Mini Section	Ages to be 10 and under on 1 <sup>st</sup> January of the competition year. One member to be 8 years and under. Seven rounds. Questions to be based on E, D and easier parts of D+ Efficiency tests and Mini Badges.
Junior/Senior	Must have two junior members to be 13 years and under on 1 <sup>st</sup> January of competition year and then two up to the age of 25. Seven rounds. Questions to be based on C, C+ and B Efficiency tests and Achievement Badges.

BLUE CROSS CARE	4 Members in a Team
Mini Section	Ages to be 10 and under on 1 <sup>st</sup> January of the competition year. One member to be 8 years and under. Seven rounds. Questions to be based on E, D and easier parts of D+ Efficiency tests and Mini Badges.
Junior	Must have two junior members to be 13 years and under on 1st January of competition year and then two up to the age of 25. Seven rounds. Questions to be based on C, C+ and B Efficiency tests and Achievement Badges.
Senior	Teams to consist of three members aged 25 years and under on the 1st of January of the competition year, with one member to be 16 years or under. Questions to be based on the Care section of the C+, B and AH Efficiency Tests.

Teams make their way around different 'stations', each of which will comprise of a different theory or practical based topic. Ten minutes are spent at each 'station', during which time Members are asked a series of questions to be marked by the Assessor. Points will be allocated per section, as well as for the manner in which Teams approach the competition. One round will be chosen, at random, as the 'tie-breaker'. In the event of a tie, the Team with the highest score in that particular round will be declared the winners.
