## Things to Know About This Competition

### Horsebox Passes

These will be emailed to you and must be printed and displayed in the front of your vehicle prior to entering the venue. You will be directed on where to park **but please follow the signage for LIGHT HORSES**. All other supporters must park in the public car park to gain entry to the event.

**HORSES SHOULD NOT BE LEFT UNATTENDED TIED TO THE OUTSIDE OF LORRIES/TRAILERS. PLEASE TAKE YOUR POO/HAY/RUBBISH HOME WITH YOU**

### Rules

**In all classes the Judge's decision is final.**

### Show Jumping

Show Jumping competition is being held under The Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2025. This includes correct tack and turnout for such a competition. For your own safety we request the removal of hooped earrings.

This is a single-phase competition where you will jump the whole course, unless eliminated, with a timed section. The course will change after 50cm and 70cm.

Show Jumping	
Knockdown	4 penalties
First disobedience of horse	4 penalties
Second disobedience of horse in whole course	8 penalties
Third disobedience of horse in whole course (each circle or crossing of tracks between fences counts as one disobedience)	Elimination
Fall of rider	Elimination
Fall of horse	Elimination
Error of course	Elimination
Failure to jump the next fence within 45 seconds	Elimination
Failure to cross the finish line mounted	Elimination
Starting before the bell	Elimination
Outside assistance is forbidden under penalty of elimination. Any intervention by a third party, whether solicited or not is considered forbidden assistance. This includes verbal instructions and 'cheering' on of competitors from 50cm and above. Competitors are not permitted to be accompanied in the ring unless in the 40cm class.

**Format:**

The gate steward will welcome entrants into the class, checking their numbers against the list. The class will then complete a "go round" the outside of the ring as a complete class on both reins; the ring steward will ask the competitors to change the rein across the diagonal.

- In Classes 8, 11, 12 and 15 this go round will include all three paces, including walk, trot and canter in formation.
- Class 8 & 17 will also be asked to complete an extension down one side one by one when given the signal by the ring steward.
- Class 15 will complete a go round in formation in walk and trot only.
- Classes 13 and 14 will complete the go round in walk and be asked to trot down one side one by one when given the signal by the ring steward.
- Class 8 & 11 will complete the go round in walk only.

The class will then be asked to line up by the ring steward. This may be in any order or in the order in which the judge has asked to see the entrants.

Each competitor in all classes, except Class 8, will then be invited by the ring steward to come out of line, stand in front of the judge for their inspection before completing an individual show. The judge may ask for a particular show or leave it to the competitor. In this case, the usual show for all classes except lead rein and in hand is:

- Walk and then trot in a straight line away from the judge,
- Complete a first loop of a figure of eight in trot,
- Cross the diagonal to change the rein and pick up canter for the second loop of the figure of eight
- Cross the diagonal again to change the rein and pick up canter for the third loop of the figure of eight.
- Coming out of the third loop, push into an extension down the long side before returning to canter, trot and walk.
- Halt where the judge has a good view of your pony and salute the judge.
- Return to your place in the line.

The individual show for lead rein and in hand classes is the same except that the competitor will complete only two loops of the figure of eight and only in trot.

The hunter class will be stripped, and Classes 9 & 12 may be stripped at the judges' discretion: after completing your show, you will return to the line-up, remove saddle and any martingale before presenting your horse or pony to the Confirmation Judge.

For those who are new to showing, this entails standing your pony/ horse up square for the judge to have a look at before walking away in a straight line from the judge, turn your pony and trot back in a straight line to and past the judge (they will move, keep straight!). Trot away from the judge and bend to the right before halting your pony and saluting the judge. Return to the line, replace your tack and remount.

### **Rings**

The Show Jumping will take place in Ring 2. The warm-up ring is next to the ring. A maximum of 8 persons permitted in the warm-up ring at any time.

Please check in with the Steward on arrival.

The Showing will take place in the Light Horse Ring unless specified otherwise. There is no warm-up ring for Showing classes. Please collect at the gate 5mins prior to the class start time.

### **Exercise of Horses/Ponies**

You may only ride in the designated rings. For safety, no exercising in the car park or public areas. No lunging is permitted on site.

### **Times and Numbers**

Numbers and times for Show Jumping can be downloaded from [www.ponyclubresults.co.uk](http://www.ponyclubresults.co.uk) on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> September and should be worn front and back in a bib. Handwritten numbers will not be accepted.

Numbers for Showing classes will be available to collect from the Show Jumping Secretary Tent at the Light Horse Ring on arrival.

### **Whips/Spurs**

Only padded jumping bats may be used in the Show Jumping Competition. The use of whips and spurs will be monitored and should be used in an appropriate fashion. Misuse will result in being asked to leave the show ground. Spurs for Pony Club members may only be worn by those with a Yellow Hat Tag.

### **Prize Giving**

All classes placed 1<sup>st</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>  
Show Jumping will be a dismounted Prize Giving at the end of the class in the ring. Competitors must be correctly dressed in their competition riding clothes (jackets etc) for prize-giving

### **Falls**

If you fall at any stage of the competition this results in Elimination and you will not be allowed to continue. All persons who experience a fall, no matter how insignificant, are asked to be checked by the Paramedic

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## Horse Show Conditions of Entry

1. By entering the competition, you are agreeing to the conditions laid out in the schedule. The decision of the judges and stewards in all cases, is final.
2. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without giving a reason.
3. Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other personal property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.
4. The competition is being run under The Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2025. <https://resources.pcuk.org/wp-content/uploads/2024/12/2025-Rulebook-Show-Jumping-221224.pdf>
5. **All horses must be fully vaccinated against equine influenza.**

6. **Equine passports must accompany all horses to the show ground. Spot checks are likely.**
7. No Refunds after the closing date for whatever reason. Before this date full refunds to be given minus booking fee.
8. No Substitution of entries after the closing date.
9. All competitors must be suitably dressed in correct riding attire. Hats must be PAS 015: 2011\* with BSI Kitemark, VG1 with BSI Kitemark, Snell E2016\* **onwards** with the official Snell label and number, ASTM-F1163 2004a **onwards** with the SEI mark or AS/NZS 3838, 2006 **onwards** and chin straps must be correctly fastened at all times when mounted. All in-hand competitors under the age of 14years are required to wear protective headgear as above.
10. Body protectors MUST comply to the BETA 2018 standard ONLY.
11. Excessive use of the whip, including repeated slapping down the shoulder, is prohibited. Use of the whip will be monitored, and excessive use may result in elimination. **PADDED JUMPING BATS ONLY PERMITTED for the Show Jumping Classes.**
12. The organisers of this event have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.



**13. All non-Pony Club competitors are not covered by The Pony Club public liability insurance and must have their own third-party cover. The Woodland Hunt Branch of The Pony Club and the organisers of this event are not legally responsible for non-Members and their insurance will not cover you.**

14. Horses and ponies must be four years or older on the day of the show and 5 years and over to compete in the jumping classes.

15. The Organisers reserve the right to alter the programme of events at their discretion and should the event be cancelled for any reason the Organisers reserve the right to retain a proportion of entry fees to cover their expenses.

16. In the interests of safety and the smooth running of the event, all competitors and accompanying persons MUST follow the instructions of show officials, and this includes directions as to the parking of vehicles.

17. Horses/ponies tied to the outside of trailers/lorries must not be left unattended.

18. Dogs must be kept on leads. Please do not leave dogs in your vehicle unattended. If dogs are found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.
