Pony Viewing & Loan/Purchase Checklist

Here are some points you may wish to consider when purchasing a new pony.

Here are some points you may wish to consider when purchasing a new pony.
I. Ask the Right Questions
☐ Why is the pony being sold or loaned?
☐ How long have the current owners had the pony?
□ Does the pony have a competition record (BE/BS/BD)?
□ What's included in the price (tack, rugs, etc.)?
☐ Ask for full videos of show jumping/XC rounds.
□ Request to see vet history (refusal = red flag).
☐ Ask about medical conditions, behavioural issues, rider suitability, and workload.
□ Check passport details: name, microchip, age, ownership history, food chain declarations, vaccination records.
2. Take Someone with You
□ Bring a Pony Club coach if possible — they can offer valuable insight.
□ Have at least one extra person with you (coach, parent, or experienced rider).
3. Try the Pony in Different Environments
□ Ride in an enclosed arena.
□ Ride in an open space (e.g. field).
□ If the first visit goes well, arrange a second viewing away from home (e.g. hired venue/arena).
4. Practical Handling & Day-to-Day Management
□ Check loading and travel: loading ease, travels alone/in company, trailer/lorry experience.
□ Handling for farrier, clipping, vet/dentist.
□ Does the pony need sedation for clipping or dentistry? Note extra costs or requirements
5. Insurance
□ Confirm if seller's personal accident insurance covers trial rides.
□ Check your own insurance as backup.
5. Vetting & Agreements
☐ Arrange a pre-purchase vetting.
□ Put a loan or purchase agreement in writing.
7. Take Your Time
□ Don't feel pressured to decide quickly.
☐ Take time to reflect after viewing.
□ Speak with your coach or trusted advisor before committing.
