OTHER VENUE SPECIFIC HAZARDS?

- current parking area is uneven concrete so no ponies to be left tied and unattended.
- two electricity poles with retaining cables close to current parking area care to be taken
- for the above reasons no riders to be mounted outside the designated riding areas.
- Old arena (if used) is next to the road (over hedge) so may be some noise from passing vehicles, possible spooking animals.
- ditch next to hedge in the show jump field, dressage field and in the parking field (to be used at future events), possible hazard if loose or uncontrolled horse. Riders and instructors to be made aware.

In the event of an incident that requires emergency services:

- Rally organiser takes charge (or instructor if this is not practical)
- Make area safe / catch loose pony - shout "LOOSE HORSE" to alert the group and close gates if necessary
- Nominate parent/helper to supervise everyone else, move them away to a safe location.
- Instruct parent/helper (as appropriate) to assist / phone 999 / find defib
